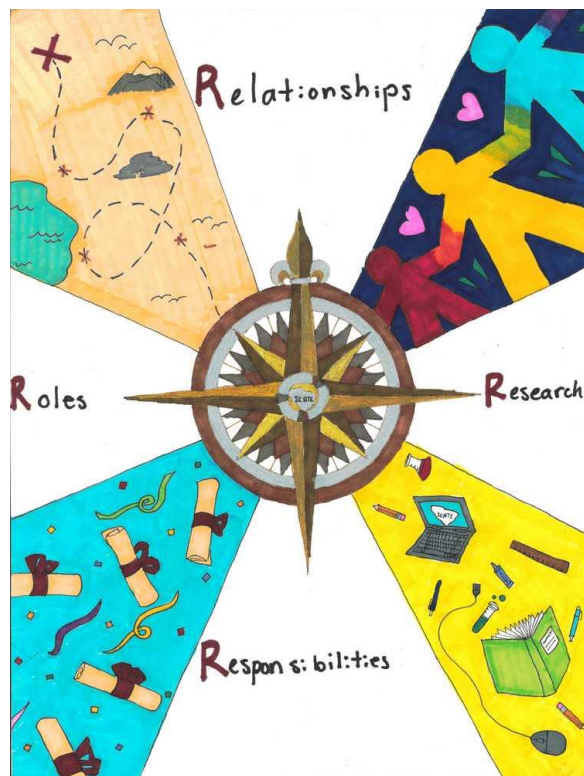

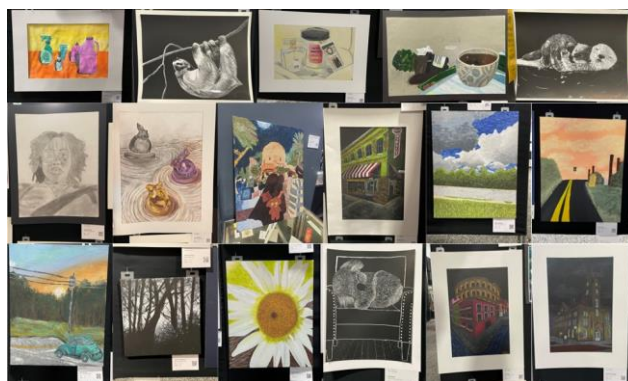

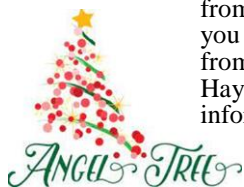
HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES

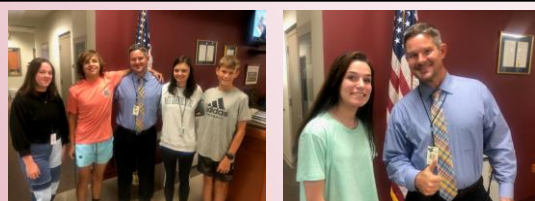

CONGRATULATIONS MCHS 2021-22 VARSITY GIRLS' SOCCER TEAM & COACH MAULDIN!

A total of 307 soccer teams (118 boys, 189 girls) from throughout the United States have earned the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award for exemplary performance in the classroom as a team during the 2021-22 academic year. Congratulations to the 2021-22 MCHS girls' soccer team on receiving this outstanding award.

To qualify for the award, the team must have a minimum grade point average of 3.25 for the entire academic year. The team GPA is determined by adding every player's GPA, then dividing by the number of players. The MCHS girls' soccer team had a 4.58 GPA.

Four of Mid-Carolina's varsity swimmers traveled to the Sol Blatt Natatorium in Columbia on October 8th to compete at the SCHSL 3A state meet. Jorja McGee (freshman), Cassidy Price (junior), Grant Smith (8th grade), and Rhett Smith (freshman) all qualified to compete at the meet. Swimmers must achieve qualifying times in order to compete. Swimmers are limited to only 2 individual events at the meet. The men's team finished 23rd in the state and the women's team finished 28th in the state. The following are the events in which the swimmers participated:

- Jorja McGee - 200 freestyle Jorja achieved a personal best time after cutting 4.4 seconds to finish 20th; 100 freestyle 26th place
- Cassidy Price - 500 freestyle 30th place
- Grant Smith - 200 freestyle 21st place; 500 freestyle 14th place
- Rhett Smith - 200 freestyle Rhett dropped 2.37 seconds for a best time and finished 19th; 500 freestyle Rhett cut 3.02 seconds for a best time and finished 21st.

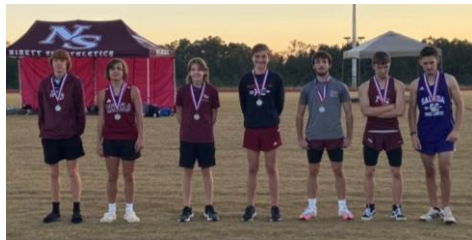

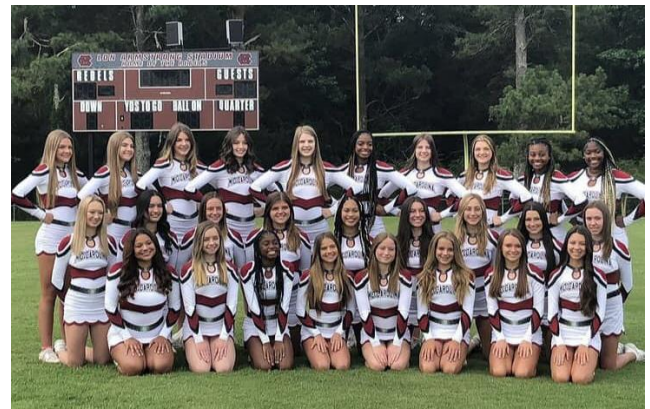

Illness Reminder:

As we are seeing increased flu activity, we need your help to reduce the spread of germs.

- It is very important to **stay home when feeling sick, and consult with your healthcare provider.**
- Ill children should stay home until 24 hours after they are fever free without the use of fever-reducing medicines.
- Keep sick children at home for at least 24 hours after they no longer have vomiting or diarrhea.
- If your child has fever, vomiting or diarrhea today, they cannot come to school tomorrow.
- If you have any questions please contact your child's school nurse.

Reinforce opportunities for students and staff to engage in hand hygiene, respiratory hygiene, and cough etiquette.

- Hand washing should occur upon reentering the building from recess, after handling trash, before eating, after coughing and sneezing, and after using the bathroom.
- Students should cover their nose and mouth with a tissue or their upper sleeve when coughing or sneezing. Place tissue in a trash bin after use and wash hands.
- Provide adequate supplies for hand washing.
