Board Role:

A local school board is a uniquely American institution. Local governance has made public schools flexible and responsive to local communities' needs.

The school board is responsible and accountable for vision, structure, advocacy, and governance. The board's functions are:

- Assessing, adopting, and evaluating policy that adheres to state and national law and reflects district values
- Developing, planning, monitoring, and assessing the district's Strategic Plan, goals, and objectives
- Representing and acting as a liaison between the community and the district
- Hiring of, and establishing goals for the evaluation of, the superintendent
- Approving, monitoring, and stewarding district assets in alignment with community priorities
- Assuring systematic review and evaluation of the district curriculum and programs
- Advocating on behalf of the district for appropriate state and national educational laws

Individual Board Members

Individual board member's authority is limited to actions taken by the board as a whole when the board is legally in session. Board members do not assume the responsibilities of administrators or other employees.
