Toy Town Elementary School Mechanical Project Scope Recommendations

1.0 Mechanical System Controls

The contractor shall provide all parts, material, equipment, and labor to furnish a complete and useable Building Management System (BMS) for existing boilers and unit ventilators and replacement exhaust fans.

The BMS shall afford complete local and remote control of equipment in addition to data trending and automatic alarm generation. The BMS shall have a graphical user interface (GUI) utilizing thermographic floorplans to visually represent real-time space temperature in comparison to zone setpoint. (Example: green shading denotes space temperature is at setpoint, yellow shading indicates space temperature exceeds setpoint by 2F, orange reflects exceedance by 4F, etc.)

Each piece of mechanical equipment shall have a unique graphical subpage reporting real-time conditions – motor status, actuator position, etc., and setpoints. Operator overrides, trend data access and alarm viewability shall be available.

Critical alarms shall automatically be transmitted via email and text message to operators.

The BMS GUI shall be accessible by the owner's on-site computers as well as locally and remotely by Android and iOS phones and tablets.

1.1 Classroom Unit Ventilator Control

Replace existing unit ventilator pneumatic controls with Direct Digital Controls (DDC). Furnish a complete and useable unit ventilator control system that can function independently as well as integrate fully with other unit ventilators, mechanical equipment, and supervisory controller or server. Existing, leaking hot water control valves shall be replaced. Unit ventilator control components shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- i. 120 VAC primary / 24 VAC power transformer
- ii. 24 VAC powered 0-10 VDC modulating position feedback outdoor air damper actuator
- iii. 24 VAC powered 0-10 VDC modulating hot water control valve actuator
- iv. Hot water coil freeze stat
- v. Discharge Air Temperature safety sensor
- vi. Space temperature and humidity sensor
- vii. Space occupancy sensor
- viii. Space CO2 sensor
- ix. External LED indicator lamp
- x. Local unit controller with onboard graphics and customizable programming capability with supervisory controller and/or server

Unit ventilators shall be programmed with adjustable occupied / unoccupied scheduling through the BMS.

During occupied periods unit ventilator supply fans shall energize and run continuously. The outdoor air damper shall open to a minimum, field determined position and modulate based on space CO2 sensor. Maximum CO2 shall be 800 ppm (adjustable). The discharge air temperature sensor shall limit outdoor air damper modulation to maintain a minimum discharge air temperature of 55F (adjustable). During a heating call, if space temperature falls 2 degrees (adjustable) below setpoint, outdoor air damper shall modulate to minimum position. If space temperature falls 4 degrees (adjustable) below setpoint outdoor air damper shall close fully and a field installed LED shall illuminate indicating full recirculation operation. An alarm shall be generated and graphically displayed on the BMS interface when the unit operates in full recirculation during occupied periods. The hot water valve shall modulate to maintain space temperature setpoint.

During unoccupied periods the hot water control valve shall open fully. Supply fan shall energize intermittently to maintain unoccupied space temperature setpoint. The outdoor air damper shall remain closed.

1.2 Ducted Unit Ventilator Control

Replace existing pneumatic controls on ducted unit ventilators in the Gymnasium (2 EA), Cafeteria, and Auditorium with DDC. Control components and sequence of control shall be similar to Classroom Unit Ventilators.

1.3 Classroom Exhaust Fan Control

Replace existing pneumatic exhaust fan controls with DDC. New DDC shall integrate with respective classroom unit ventilator DDC and BMS.

During occupied periods exhaust fan shall be energized during a cooling call when the outdoor air damper is commanded to the maximum position. The exhaust fan shall not be energized during heating calls. The exhaust fan shall not run during an unoccupied period.

1.4 Boiler Plant Control

Integrate existing central boiler controllers via BACnet protocol to BMS supervisory controller. Import all critical points for control monitoring and alarm notifications. The BMS GUI shall afford the operator the ability to select heating hot water temperature controlled by outdoor air reset or demand control. The demand control supply temperature setpoint algorithm shall utilize the aggregate total of individual zone heating demands to reset supply water temperature to precisely match building heating load.

The BMS shall monitor and control the associated boiler plant circulators.

The boiler plant shall be enabled when outdoor air is below 60F (adjustable). Circulators shall be energized and run continuously regardless of zone demand.

1.5 Rooftop Exhaust Fan Control

New, replacement rooftop exhaust fans (REF) shall be controlled and fully integrated with BMS. Fan speeds shall be controlled by sending a 0-10 VDC signal to the unit's ECM. Each REF shall have a unique subpage within the BMS GUI. REF runtime shall be scheduled through the BMS. Occupancy sensors within bathrooms shall afford exhaust fan operation during unoccupied periods.

2.0 Rooftop Exhaust Fan Replacement

Provide all parts, materials, equipment, and labor to replace 22 existing rooftop exhaust fans (REF) with new units. Fans shall utilize Electronically Commutated Motors (ECM) with the provision to receive a 0-10 VDC signal from the BMS. Mounting of new units shall not require alteration of existing roof curbs. Reference "Roof Fan & F.A. Intake Schedule" from Sheet HV-3 of original design drawings for airflow requirements and service areas.

REFs serving bathroom areas shall be resized to provide 75 CFM per water closet/urinal. New occupancy sensors shall be installed in bathrooms to integrate with BMS permitting energization of REF upon occupant entry during unoccupied control periods.

Existing duct dampers shall either be repaired - restoring proper operation, or replaced with new ones for each REF.

I. General Purpose

Sealed bids will be received for the mechanical project, 175 Grove Street, Winchendon, MA. Bids should be submitted to Joan Landers, Central Office, Toy Town Elementary School, 175 Grove Street, Winchendon, MA. Bids are due on Monday, February 1, 2021, at 10:00 am.

II. Scope of Work

Provide all labor, materials, equipment, tools, supervision, and all items necessary for the completion of the Toy Town Elementary School Mechanical Project as directed by the Director of Facilities, or designee, in accordance with the requirements and needs of the Winchendon Public Schools ("District").

Toy Town Elementary School educates students from Grade 3 to grade 5.

III. General Requirements

- The Work under the Contract consists of an installation of labor, materials, equipment, tools, and all items necessary to complete the TTE Mechanical Project. All work shall be performed by an HVAC/ Mechanical Contractor in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations.
- All bids are subject to the provisions of M.G. L. Chapter149. Wages are subject to prevailing minimum wages determined by the Department of Labor and industries pursuant to M.G.L.Chapter 149, Section 26 and 27. The Winchendon Public Schools is an Equal Opportunity Employer and encourages MBE/WBE/DBE participation in response to the bid process.
- 3) All bids must be submitted in a sealed envelope marked BID No 0343-JL21 and "Toy Town Mechanical Project" and delivered to the Superintendent's Office. Bids shall be accepted until 10:00 am on Monday, February 1, 2021, at which time they will be publicly opened and read. No bid shall be accepted or allowed after the time and date specified. Bids received after this deadline will remain unopened. The Winchendon Public Schools reserves the right to accept any bid in whole or part, to reject any/or all bids, and to waive minor irregularities and/or informalities as it deems to be in the best interest of the Winchendon Public Schools. No Bidder may withdraw his bid for a period of thirty (30) days (Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded) after the actual date of the opening of the General Bids.
- 4) Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, equipment, and supplies as required in accordance with specifications.
- 5) A mandatory pre-site visit with Director of Facilities, Martin Johnson, will be held on Tuesday, January 19, and Thursday, January 21, 2021 and January 22, 2021 @ 12:00 pm, starting at the Central Office, 175 Grove Street, Winchendon, MA 01475 to inspect the facility and determine square footage for the project. Please wear appropriate COVID 19 protective equipment (i.e. facemask) and adhere to social distancing throughout.
- 6) Contractor must certify that all employees on the worksite have successfully completed at least 10 hours of OSHA approved training, pursuant to M.G.L. c. 30, 39S.

- 7) PPB/Monitoring Equipment: Safety Clothing and Equipment: Each worker shall wear, at a minimum: safety shoes, safety glasses, and head protection (facemask) at all times during work activities. Each item must meet or exceed ASTM and ANSI standards governing apparel.
- 8) Contractor shall obtain all permits, inspections, licenses, and certificates required for work. All work shall be performed in strict conformity with all laws, regulations, and ordinances of the federal, state, and municipal governments, and all departments and bureaus thereof having jurisdiction. All permit fees for local permits issued by the Winchendon Public Schools for work under the contemplated contract shall be waived. It shall be incumbent upon the contractor to notify the Director of Facilities of their arrival at and departure from the Jobsite. A copy of the service report (including date of work, start time and finish time, name(s) of person(s) performing work and time each person worked, a brief description of the work shall be left at the Jobsite upon the completion of the work. All adjustments and alterations covered by this contract are subject to the owner's approval.
- 9) All materials and equipment supplied by the contractor must be free of any lien, claim, or encumbrance.
- 10) Inspections and planned work are to be made 7:00 a.m. through 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The Director of Facilities may authorize work outside of these hours or days.
- 11) Rates shall include all travel, truck and mileage costs. No separate travel, truck, fuel, mileage or equipment charges will be accepted. No other method or items of compensation shall be paid other than on the basis specified herein and submitted on the submitted Bid Form.
- 12) Invoicing must be issued upon completion and satisfactory inspection of HVAC and Mechanical installation and shall reference the job on the invoice. The contractor may only invoice for work completed. All invoices shall reference the relevant dates and projects for authorized work. Applicable payroll reporting forms for prevailing wage rates and a signed statement of compliance must be submitted with all invoices. No invoices will be processed for payment without the above-referenced documentation.
- 13) Purchases made by the District are exempt from state sales tax and federal excise taxes and materials invoiced to the District must exclude such taxes. Tax exemption certificates will be furnished upon request.
- 14) All workmanship by the successful bidder shall be guaranteed against failure or defects during normal use for a period of one (1) year from the date of completion of the work. All materials and parts supplied by the successful bidder will have the standard manufacturers' warranties. Contractor(s) shall provide all equipment warranty documentation to the District. Any defective materials, equipment, or parts supplied by the contractor shall be replaced at no cost to the District.

- 15) The contractor shall, without expense to the District, maintain during the term of the agreement the following insurance coverage with the specified limits:
 - a. Bodily injury liability insurance, including accidental death, with limits of not less than \$500,000 for each occurrence and \$1,000,000 aggregate.
 - b. Property damage liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$5,000,000 aggregate.
 - c. If automotive equipment is used in the operation, automotive bodily injury and property damage combined insurance of not less than \$500,000 for each occurrence.
 - d. Workers Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance as required by the Commonwealth providing coverage for all claims pursuant to MGL Ch 152
 - e. The District shall be named as an additional insured on the entire policy with respect to liability. The Insurance Certificate must be written in the name of the Winchendon Public Schools as an additional insured. The certificate must have the endorsement of the insurance agency. The policy must contain a notation that the insurer will give 10 days' notice to the District prior to cancellation, change, or non-renewal of the policy. Notice of occurrence or incident is to be given to the Commissioner. All carriers must have an A.M. Best rating of A or better. The District reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to amend the insurance requirements as set forth above. The Contractor shall require the same insurances from its subcontractors.
- The contractor must supply all applicable MSDS forms as requested by the District. Pursuant to MGL Chapter 11IF, Sections 8-10, any vendor who receives a contract resulting from this invitation agrees to submit a Material Safety Data Sheet for each toxic or hazardous substance or mixture containing such substance when deliveries are made. The contractor agrees to comply with all requirements set forth in the pertinent laws.
- 17) The contractor will sign in at the front office of the building and shall notify the building custodian prior to performing work during normal work hours. After hours, the contractor will be given directions from the Director of Facilities on building procedures as needed.
- 18) Contractors shall keep all exterior doors locked and not propped ajar or dogged open. Any property damaged by the contractor in carrying out the provisions of this contract shall be restored to its original condition by and at the expense of the contractor. The Facilities Director shall hold the contractor responsible for any property that is lost or stolen during the execution of the work. The contractor shall prohibit their employees from smoking while on District property, and shall be held responsible for any damage caused by smoking by any employees.

- 19) All materials, supplies, tools, ladders, and debris shall be cleared away or cleaned up as appropriate immediately upon ending work for a day and when finishing a work project, and all such things shall be removed from the building, leaving the premises in a swept-clean condition.
- 20) Contractors are to be mindful of building occupants and must keep occupied work areas clear and free from hazards.
- All contractor personnel and/or subcontractors must have passed and have current Massachusetts CORI requirements and Federal fingerprinting requirements for work in occupied school buildings.
- 22) Work should begin in February and must be completed prior to June 30, 2021.
- 23) The Contractor shall furnish a Payment Bond, acceptable to the District, as security for the faithful payment of its obligations under the Contract. Said Payment Bond shall be in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Price and shall be issued by a surety company qualified to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and approved by the District. Said Payment Bond shall obligate the Contractor, its surety, and their successors and assigns to pay for labor, materials, and equipment furnished for use regarding the Work to be performed by the Contractor under the Contract. Said Payment Bond shall remain in effect no less than one (1) year after the expiration of the term of the Contract, or any extension or renewal thereof.
- 24) AHERA Policy: 1. All work should coincide with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Remediation Act (AHERA) in schools. This federal program regulates disturbance to Asbestos Containing Materials (ACM) in school buildings. The District has provided Asbestos Management Plans to every school building within the district. These are located in the main office. The Contractor must ensure not to disturb ACM in schools without the proper procedures in place.

IV. Detailed Specifications

- 16) The contractor must be qualified, appropriately licensed by the Commonwealth in the field employed or the trade undertaken. The contractor must have a minimum of 5 years' licensed or certified experience in the subject trade. The contractor shall use only trained and licensed or certified personnel to perform the services, directly employed and supervised by him/her.
- 17) All contractor personnel shall have a copy of all required certifications and licenses on their person when on District property. All persons operating a motor vehicle on public ways or off of public ways and on District property must possess a current valid driver's license to operate a motor vehicle.
- 18) The contractor shall give personal supervision to the work and shall employ a competent tradesman during the progress of the work. A contractor shall employ an efficient number of competent workmen who are experienced thoroughly in this type of work.

- 19) A contractor may employ for his own use the present electrical and water services in a building or facility, if any, in order to perform the work. A contractor shall be held responsible for all damages to such services or equipment, or damage caused by such services if such damage were by reason of his or his subcontractors' use of such services or equipment.
- 20) The prevailing wage rates attached, as determined by the Massachusetts Department of Labor and Workforce Development, and any amendments are applicable to any work performed under the contemplated contract by the contractor.

Bid Requirements:

- 1) A Bid Deposit, in the amount of 5% of the value of the total bid made payable to the Winchendon Public Schools must accompany each bid. Unsuccessful bidders' bonds will be returned immediately following the award to the successful bidder.
 - The bid proposal must be filled out on the Bid Form prescribed and included with this Invitation to Bid. It should be fully completed and enclosed in a sealed envelope which shall have written on the outside, "BIDS" and shall indicate the title, "Toy Town Mechanical Project" Bid No.0343-JL 21 as well as the name and address of the bidder.
- 2) In case of perceived ambiguity, inconsistency, error, or omission in any 1TB bid document, or a conflict between the provisions of a bidding law or regulation and the ITB bid documents, then the bidder is required to draw such matters to the attention of the District through its Superintendent, Joan Landers Director of Facilities, Martin Johnson. The District will then clarify the situation as to the true intended interpretation and shall notify each and every person who is on record as having received the bid documents of this ITB through the issuance of an Addendum to the ITB bid documents. The District will not beheld responsible for any oral instructions or changes to the ITB bid documents. If a bidder fails to draw such a matter to the attention of the District, as required herein, then their bid conclusively will be presumed to have been based upon the interpretation which may be given subsequently by the District, or, if such conflict is with a law or regulation, the bid conclusively is presumed to be predicated upon full compliance with such law or regulation.
- 4) This is an Invitation to Bid ("ITB") and is NOT a request for proposals. A bidder must meet the minimum stated requirements, and shall be evaluated based upon the requirements herein. The District reserves the right to award more than one contract under this ITB.
- 5) Any questions regarding this solicitation or specifications must be in writing to the District through its Superintendent, Joan Landers or Director of Facilities, Martin Johnson @ jlanders@winchendonk:12.org or_mjohnson@winchendonk12.org no later than 4:00 pm on January 22, 2021. If appropriate, the district may generate an amendment to the 1TB bid documents.

- 6) A bidder is to familiarize himself thoroughly with all the documents making up this 1TB, as it is to be conclusively understood that all bids are based upon full compliance with the various provisions contained in this ITB bid documents and any issued Addenda. These same documents will be incorporated into the contract documents.
- 7) A bidder must sign and submit with the Bid Form the certificates as to corporate/signatory authority, non-collusion, tax compliance, debarment and Certification regarding OSHA Training, and the required DCAMM certificates, each included with the ITB bid documents and a bidder must include each with the Bid Form in the above described sealed envelope containing the completed Bid Form.
- 8) No bid received after the closing time and date established in this ITB for the receipt of bids will be considered regardless of the cause fordelay.
- 9) A bidder may correct, modify, or withdraw a bid by submission of a sealed, written notice clearly marked as a correction, modification, or withdrawal and received by the District through its Director of Facilities, Martin Johnson, prior to the deadline for submission in this ITB and time and date set for the bid opening.
- 10) Bidders are required to complete and submit the Qualification and Reference Forms provided in this bid package in accordance with the instructions printed herein, and must include them with the Bid Form in the above described sealed envelope containing the completed Bid Form.

Rule for Award:

- The pricing of labor, materials (including any and all markup) as well as experience, qualifications, and references of a bidder will be used to evaluate bids.
- 2) A successful bidder must have demonstrated experience performing similar services for commercial properties, municipalities, or school districts over the past five years.
- 3) In order to be responsible and responsive to this ITB, each bidder must have:
 - a. Five (5) or more years in the HVAC industry and must hold all required licenses from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts;
 - b. Three (3) commercial, municipal, or school district references indicating the bidder's services, quality of work, response times, personnel qualifications, business and billing office competence, equipment and parts locating ability, and pricing ability.
 - c. a copy of a "Certificate of Eligibility" issued by the Deputy Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance (DCAMM) showing that the Bidder has the classification and capacity rating to perform the work required. (The DCAMM classification

required for this project is "Installation, renovation repair, and maintenance of the systems and apparatus required, collectively or individually, to provide comfort heating, ventilation and/or cooling within or associated with a building, including such incidental or related work as is customarily performed by those in the HVAC trade.

This category does not include sheet metal work by itself and (4) an update statement in such form as the Deputy Commissioner of DCAMM shall prescribe.

Any certifications and/or licenses of personnel intended to be performing services under the contemplated contract must have such license on their person at all times which performing under the contemplated contract(s).

- 4) A successful bidder must possess adequate labor, equipment, engineering, and management capabilities to effectively service this contract.
- 5) Items or services equaling or exceeding the specifications will be considered as meeting the specifications.
- 6) Bids submitted pursuant to this ITB will be reviewed and evaluated pursuant to standards required by MGL Chapter 149, considering a responsible and eligible bidder's pricing structure, first in regard to overall cost.
- 7) Failure to comply with any of the above Bid Requirements or Rules of Award or any other requirement or specifications will be justification to reject any bid as incomplete.
- 8) The District reserves the right to award a contract pursuant to this ITB to more than one responsive responsible bidder from among the bidders.
- 9) The District reserves the right not to award any contract under this ITB.
- 10) The District will award the contract, if at all, to the lowest responsive, responsible, and eligible bidder.

Contract Terms and Conditions: (See Exhibit A)

- The contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the District, and all of its officers, agents, and employees against all suits, claims, and liabilities of every name and nature for any injuries to persons or damage to property arising out of or relating to any acts of, or failure to act by, the Contractor, his/her employees, agents, or subcontractors, in the performance of the work of this contract or failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the contract.
- The District reserves the right to cancel the contract on fifteen (15) days notice and to award the contract to the next lowest bidder on the evidence of the contractor's failure to perform in accordance with specifications, and the contractor shall have no legal recourse or claim against the District.
- 3) The District may cancel this contract at any time without cause upon thirty days prior notice. The District may cancel this contract at any time for just cause upon 24-hours written notice. Upon termination, the Contractor is only entitled to be

- paid for work performed and completed and not for lost profits and/or any indirect overhead costs. The Contractor shall be liable for liquidated damages if it fails to complete the project by the specified date.
- The contractor shall conform to all requirements of federal, state, and local laws, including OSHA standards and prevailing wage laws. Respondents shall agree to comply with the Prevailing Wage Law. All employees of Contractors engaged in these activities shall be paid at least these rates for any work performed under a Contract resulting from this RFR when working in a public building or on public work. Contractors are required to complete Certified Weekly Payroll Records when applicable.
- 5) Copies of all certifications and licenses for personnel utilized during the term of the contract, or the extended term of the contract, must be updated, kept current, and maintained on file with the Director of Facilities.
- There must be no assignment of a contract awarded under this ITB to third parties unless expressly agreed to in writing by the Director of Facilities, and any such assignment must be on identical terms to the contract excepting only the responsible contractor.
- The selected contractor(s) shall provide blanket performance bonds and materials/payment bonds each in the full amount of the contract price as stated above. Neither the value of such bonds nor any potential or estimated value of each contemplated contract shall in any way require the District to place service, repair, maintenance, replacement orders, or new work up to such amounts during any term of the contemplated contract(s). By submitting a bid, the contractor agrees to execute the contract, provide the insurance certificates, bonds, and other required documents, and to commence work within the time limits specified herein.
 - The contract shall be considered to include all terms and conditions required to be included in it by Massachusetts law, as amended, as though such laws were set forth in full therein, including but not limited to 30 MGL 39N-O, 149 MGL 26-27, 30 MGL 39S, 39L, 39F, G, K, 39R, 39P, 44 MGL 31C, 62C MGL 49A.
 - 9). The Contractor understands that the Massachusetts Conflict of Interest Law, Chapter 268A of the Massachusetts General Laws, applies to the Contractor with respect to the services required to be provided under this Contract. The Contractor and its officers, employees, agents, subcontractors, and affiliated agencies shall not participate in any activity which constitutes a violation of the Massachusetts Conflict of Interest Law or which creates an appearance of a violation of the Massachusetts Conflict of Interest Law.

	The Contractor shall furnish all supplies, equipment, and labor necessary for the performance of the services required by this Contract in accordance with the applicable professional standards in the Eastern Massachusetts area. The Contractor warrants that it has in its employ, and throughout the term of the Contract or any extension or renewal thereof, will continue to have a sufficient number of persons experienced in developing and providing services required by this Contract, such that the Contractor's obligations under the Contract will be carried out in a prompt, safe and professional manner.
3.	Term
	The term of this Contract shall commence as of the execution date of this contract and shall end Time is of the essence in the performance of services rendered by the Contractor under this Contract. The Contractor, therefore, shall achieve final completion of the work by

If the said Contractor shall neglect, fail, of refuse to complete the work within the time herein specified, or any proper extension thereof granted by the Owner, then the Contractor does hereby agree, as a part consideration for the awarding of this Contract, to pay to the Owner the amount specified in the Contract, not as a penalty but as liquidated damages for such breach of contract has hereinafter set forth, for each and every calendar day that the Contractor shall be in default after the time stipulated in the Contract for completing the work.

The said amount of liquidated damages is fixed and agreed upon by and between the Contractor and the Owner because of the impracticability and extreme difficulty of fixing and ascertaining the actual damages the Owner would sustain in such event and said amount shall be retained from time to time by the Owner from current periodic estimates, monies which may be then due, or which may become due and payable to the Contractor a sum sufficient to compensate the Owner for the costs and expenses of employing architects, engineers, inspectors and employees to the extent that their services are reasonably required during the period of default. These expenses also include, but are not limited to, additional costs due to the rental or lease or the extension of any rental or lease agreement for buildings to house students and the rental or lease or the extension of any rental or lease agreement or the purchase of any vehicles to transport students, and additional security to maintain the project site and any other site used to house students because of the Contractor's delay.

Fourth Priority: IFI

Fifth Priority: Contractor's Response.

5. Payment

In consideration for performance of the work in accordance with the requirements of this Contract, and in accordance with M.G.L. c.30, §39K, the Schools shall pay the Contractor the prices set forth in the Contractor's Response, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

This Contract is a fixed price contract; and, therefore, miscellaneous expenditures associated with the Contractor's work on this project shall not be paid by the Schools. In the event that an unforeseen miscellaneous expense is incurred, the Contractor shall receive the Schools' approval in writing prior to incurring the expense if it will subsequently seek payment of said expense from the Schools.

Payment shall be made to the Contractor for work completed in accordance with this Contract. All requests for payment shall be submitted to the Schools as an invoice and shall specify work completed, progress made toward completing deliverables, the number of hours worked, the classification of each employee who performed work, and the billing rate for each employee who performed work on the project.

Payment will be due fifteen (15) days after receipt of the Contractor's invoice by the Schools for services rendered in accordance with this Contract. The Schools shall not make payments in advance.

If the Schools objects to all or part of any invoice, the Schools shall notify the Contractor in writing within two (2) weeks of the date of receipt of the invoice, and shall pay that portion of the invoice not in dispute within fifteen (15) days after the date of receipt of the invoice.

Should it be necessary for the Contractor to engage the services of a specialized contractor or companies other than those originally proposed in the Contractor's response to the Schools' Invitation for Bid, the Contractor shall take such measures only with the Schools' prior written approval. Charges for such services shall be billed directly to the Schools unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties.

Payment of the amounts due under this Contract shall release the Schools, and its officers, employees, boards, commissions, committees, agents and representatives, from any and all claims and liability in any way relating to this Contract or anything done in pursuance thereof.

No payment by the Schools to the Contractor shall be deemed to be a waiver of any right of the Schools under this Contract or ratification by the Schools of any breach hereof by the Contractor.

6. Warranty

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Any equipment delivered, unless otherwise agreed by the parties, shall be of generally merchantable quality and shall be fit for the purpose sought by the Schools. All manufacturers' warranties on any equipment delivered shall be assigned to the Schools.

7. Compliance with Laws

The Contractor shall comply with all provisions of Federal, Massachusetts, and local law applicable to his work including, without limitation, statutes, by-laws, rules, regulations, orders and directives, as amended, and including, without limitation, the Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, as amended, and related regulations, as amended, in effect throughout the term of this Contract and any extension or renewal thereof. Without limitation, the Contractor shall comply with the provisions of Chapter 149, Section 26 to 27D of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, and the applicable minimum wage rates as determined by the Massachusetts Commissioner of Labor and Industries. This Contract shall be considered to include in their entirety all terms respecting workers' compensation insurance and other terms required to be included in it by Chapter 152 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, and applicable provisions of any other laws, including, without limitation, Chapter 30, Sections 39F, 39G, 39K, 39L, 39M, 39N, 39O, 39P, and 39R and S of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, and Chapter 149, Sections 34, 34A, and 34B of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, and Chapter 82, Section 40 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, as though such terms were set forth in their entirety herein.

8. Insurance

The Contractor shall provide and maintain throughout the term of the Contract and any extension or renewal thereof the following insurance with companies that are authorized and licensed in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to issue policies for the coverages and limits so required.

- a. Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and employer's liability insurance in the amount of \$500,000/\$500,000/\$500,000.
- b. Commercial General Liability Insurance, \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate limit. Commercial General Liability insurance shall include personal injury liability, broad form property damage liability, products/completed operations liability and broad form contractual liability.
- c. Automobile Liability Insurance, covering all leased, owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles Combined single limit of \$1,000,000.
- d. Excess Liability Insurance, Umbrella Form \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate, which shall be following form, providing coverage over commercial general liability insurance, automobile liability insurance, and employer's liability under workers' compensation

insurance.

- e. The Schools shall be named as an additional insured on each such policy of Commercial General Liability Insurance, Excess Liability Insurance, Umbrella Form, and Automobile Liability Insurance.
- f. All certificates and policies shall contain the following provision:
 - "Notwithstanding any other provision herein, should any of the above policies be cancelled or materially amended before the expiration date thereof, the issuing company will mail thirty (30) days prior written notice thereof to the named certificate holder and to the Superintendent of the Winchendon Public Schools, 175 Grove Street, Winchendon, MA 01475 before such cancellation or amendment shall take place."
- g. Certificates evidencing such insurance in five (5) copies shall be furnished to the Schools at the execution of this Agreement. Such certificates shall not merely name the types of policy provided, but shall specifically refer to this Agreement and shall state that such insurance is as required by this Agreement. The Contractor shall make no claims against the Schools or its officers for any injury to any of its officers or employees or for damage to its equipment arising out of work contemplated by the Agreement.
- h. The Contractor shall also be required to provide to the Schools with its proof of insurance coverage endorsements or riders to the policies of commercial general liability insurance, automobile liability insurance, and excess liability insurance, umbrella form, which indicate that the Schools is named as an additional insured on each such policy.
- i. No insurance shall be obtained from an insurer which:
 - (1) is not licensed to sell insurance in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; or
 - (2) is not authorized to provide insurance as an excess or surplus lines insurer, and does not have a current Best's rating of A or better.
- j. Failure to provide and continue in force such insurance as aforesaid shall be deemed a material breach of this Contract and shall operate as an immediate termination thereof.
- k. The Contractor shall provide to the Schools a copy of a certificate of insurance that provides evidence of all environmental liability insurance maintained by the Contractor.
- 9. Indemnification

The Contractor shall compensate the Schools for all damage to School property of any nature arising out of the Contractor's work. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Schools and all of its officers, employees, boards, commissions, committees, agents and representatives from and against all claims, causes of action, suits, costs, damages, and liability of any kind which arise out of the breach by the Contractor of its obligations under this Contract, or the act or omission of the Contractor, its subcontractors, or their officers, employees, agents and representatives or anyone directly or indirectly employed by them, or anyone for whose acts or omissions they may be liable, regarding the work to be performed by the Contractor under the Contract, or which arise out of the violation of any federal, Massachusetts or local statute, by-law, rule, regulation, order or directive, or which relate to personal injury or property damage suffered by the Contractor or any of its officers or employees regarding the subject matter of this Contract. Said costs shall include, without limitation, reasonable legal costs, collections fees, and counsel fees incurred in defending any claim or suit that may be brought against the Schools and any judgment that may be obtained in any such claim or suit.

10. No Personal Liability

Neither the Schools, nor its officers, employees, boards, committees, commissions, agents and representatives shall be under any personal obligation or incur any personal liability by reason of this Contract, the execution thereof or anything relating thereto which arises out of the breach or violation of any provision of this Contract, or the violation of any Federal, Massachusetts or local statute, by-law, rule, regulation, order or directive, or which relates to personal injury or property damage suffered by the Contractor or its employees, regarding the subject matter of this Contract.

11. Familiarity with Area of Work

By signing this Contract, the Contractor acknowledges that it has examined the area of work which is the subject matter of this Contract and that it is familiar with all sites which are the subject of this Contract and with all conditions of the IFB and of this Contract. The Contractor has entered into this Contract in reliance on its own examinations and estimates as to the amount and character of its work, and conditions which may be encountered in the performance thereof, and shall assume all risks and bear all losses pertaining thereto.

12. Performance Bond

The Contractor shall furnish a Performance Bond, acceptable to the Owner, as security for the faithful performance of its obligations under the Contract. Said Performance Bond shall be in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract

Price and shall be issued by a surety company qualified to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and approved by the Owner. Said Performance Bond shall obligate the Contractor, its surety, and their successors and assigns for all of the Work required to be performed by the Contractor under the Contract. Said performance Bond shall remain in effect no less than one (1) year after the expiration of the term of the Contract, or any extension or renewal thereof.

13. Labor and Materials Payment Bond

The Contractor shall furnish a Payment Bond, acceptable to the Owner, as security for the faithful payment of its obligations under the Contract. Said Payment Bond shall be in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Price and shall be issued by a surety company qualified to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and approved by the Owner. Said Payment Bond shall obligate the Contractor, its surety, and their successors and assigns to pay for labor, materials and equipment furnished for use regarding the Work to be performed by the Contractor under the Contract. Said Payment Bond shall remain in effect no less than one (1) year after the expiration of the term of the Contract, or any extension or renewal thereof.

14. Independent Contractor Status

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The Contractor shall provide services under this Contract as an independent contractor with the Schools and not as an employee of the Schools. No employee, agent or representative of the Contractor shall be entitled to receive any benefits of employment with the Schools, including without limitation salary, overtime, vacation pay, holiday pay, sick leave, health insurance, life insurance, pension or deferred compensation.

15. Use of Alcohol and Controlled Substances Prohibited

The Contractor hereby acknowledges that the use of alcoholic beverages, narcotics, and mood altering substances, except for current valid, legal prescriptions, by any officer, employee, agent, or representative of the Contractor is prohibited on Schools property which is the subject matter of this Agreement and during all hours of work under this Agreement. If any officer, employee, agent, or representative of the Contractor violates the foregoing provision, the Schools shall have the right to order that such officer, employee, agent, or representative of the Contractor shall not be permitted to return to work on this Agreement. Under such circumstances, the Contractor shall promptly remove the subject officer, employee, agent, or representative from the job site and shall not permit the subject officer, employee, agent, or representative to perform further work in conjunction with this Agreement.

16. No Smoking

Pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws (M.G.L.) c. 270, §22, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Smokefree Workplace Law, the Contractor, its officers, employees, agents, and representatives shall refrain from smoking and from using tobacco products in any public building in the Schools.

17. Criminal Background Screening

For each employee of the Contractor who is performing services under this Contract, the Contractor shall, subject to its confidentiality and privacy obligations owing to its employees and third parties, provide a written confirmation to the Schools that such employee passed the Contractor's preemployment criminal background screen. In the event that any employee refuses to permit the Contractor to provide such information to the Schools, the Contractor shall not assign such employee to perform services for the Schools, and such employee shall not be authorized to perform services for the Schools. The Schools shall be permitted to keep such information in its files.

18. Delays/Force Majeure

Except as specifically set forth in this Contract, neither party shall hold the other responsible or liable for damages or delays in performance caused by acts of God, interruptions in the availability of labor, or other events beyond the control of the other party, or that could not have been reasonably foreseen or prevented. For this purpose, such acts or events shall include unusually severe weather affecting performance of services, floods, epidemics, wars, riots, strikes, lockouts, or other industrial disturbances, protest demonstrations, and project site conditions which could not have been reasonably anticipated. Should such acts or events occur, both parties shall use their best efforts to overcome the difficulties arising and to resume as soon as reasonably possible the normal pursuit of the services for the Project.

19. Termination

- a. If the Contractor shall breach any provision of this Contract, which breach is not cured within twenty-one (21) days of written notice thereof from the Schools to the Contractor, the Schools shall have the right to terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor.
- b. If any assignment shall be made by the Contractor or by any guarantor of the Contractor for the benefit of creditors, or if a petition is filed by the Contractor or by any guarantor of the Contractor for adjudication as a bankrupt, or for reorganization or an arrangement under any provision of the Bankruptcy Act as then in force and effect, or if an involuntary petition

under any of the provisions of the Bankruptcy Act is filed against the Contractor and such involuntary petition is not discharged within ninety (90) days thereafter, in any event the Schools may terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor.

- c. The award of this Contract and the continued operation of this Contract are contingent upon appropriation by the Schools and Town of sufficient money to fund the Contract. Should Town Meeting fail to appropriate necessary funds therefor, the Schools shall no longer be under any obligation to tender performance, including payment, under the terms of this Contract. In that event, the Schools may terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor.
- d. The Schools may terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor if a source of money to fund the Contract is lost during the Contract term. In the alternative, the parties may agree in writing to amend the Contract to provide for a Contract price which represents a reduced appropriation for the Contract term.
- e. The Schools may also terminate this Contract for convenience upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor.

In the event of termination, the Contractor shall be entitled to be paid for services rendered in accordance with this Contract prior to termination.

In the event that this Contract is terminated pursuant to Section 19a. or 19b. above, the Schools may make any reasonable purchase or contract to purchase services in substitution for services due from the Contractor and may deduct the cost of any substitute contract, or damages sustained by the Schools due to non performance or non conformance of services together with incidental and consequential damages from the Contract price, and shall withhold such damages from sums due or sums which become due.

20. Notices

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Except as otherwise provided in this Contract all notices required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be delivered by certified mail or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the parties at the following address or such other address or addresses as to which a party shall have notified the other party in accordance with this Section 20.

21. Miscellaneous Provisions

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- a. Any action at law or suit in equity instituted by the Contractor as a result of the performance, non-performance or alleged breach of this Contract shall be filed in the Superior Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for Worcester County, MA, and in no other court or jurisdiction.
- b. No action or failure to act by the Schools shall constitute a waiver of a right or duty afforded to the Schools under the Contract, nor shall such action or failure to act constitute approval of or acquiescence in a breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing. No forbearance or indulgence in any form or manner by the Schools shall be construed as a waiver or in any way limit the legal or equitable remedies available to the Schools. No waiver by the Schools of any default or breach by the Contractor shall constitute a waiver of any subsequent default or breach.
- c. If the Contractor discovers or is informed of any discrepancy or inconsistency in the Contract Documents in relation to any law, statute, ordinance, by-law, decree, code, rule, regulation, or order, the Contractor shall promptly, before commencing services under this Contract, report the same to the Schools in writing.
- d. The Contractor acknowledges that it has not been influenced to enter into this Contract, nor has the Contractor relied upon any warranties or representations not set forth in this instrument.
- e. The Contractor shall maintain the confidentiality of information designated by the Schools as confidential, unless withholding such information would violate the law or create a risk of significant harm to the public, or unless the Contractor has been required to release such information by final judgment or order of a court of competent

jurisdiction, or unless the Schools has expressly waived such confidentiality in advance in writing.

- f. The Contractor shall not represent or purport to represent that it speaks for the Schools vis-à-vis the media or the public at-large without the Schools' express, written consent in advance.
- g. Prior to commencing services under this Contract, the Contractor shall furnish the Schools, in writing, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of not fewer than two (2) principal employees of his business who are to be contacted in the event of an after-hours emergency.
- h. By entering into this Agreement, the Contractor certifies under penalties of perjury that its Response was made and submitted in good faith and without collusion or fraud with any person. - i. - 1. The Contractor shall not discriminate against or exclude any person from participation herein on grounds of race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation (which shall not include persons whose sexual orientation involves minor children as the sex object), age, genetic information, ancestry, children, marital status, veteran status or membership in the armed services, the receiving of public assistance, and handicap. The previous sentence shall include, but not be limited to, the following: advertising, recruitment; hiring; rates of pay or

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other forms of compensation; terms; conditions or privileges of employment; employment upgrading; transfer; demotion; layoff; and termination. - r. If any provision, or portion thereof, of this Contract shall be adjudged to be invalid or unenforceable by final judgment or order of a court of competent jurisdiction the remaining provisions shall continue in effect to the extent permitted by law.
- s. The provisions of this Contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, assigns and successors in interest of the parties.
- t. This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, regardless of choice of law issues or principles.
