Greetings Falcon Nation,

As we come off of the holiday break I am reflecting on our first semester and how thankful I am that we were able to remain in person learning the entire semester and for our staff and all of the work they do. As I look around the buildings each day I see some of the extra duties that have been added to them. Many of the new jobs they have picked up go unnoticed by most people and they also go unrecognized. I would like to recognize one of those groups of people. I read a message by Becky Reier from Kearney and it got me to thinking about how I overlook some of the things that are being done. Some of the following thoughts came from her. This group of people are part-time employees of the district and yet hold one of the most precious jobs. Some of them are retired from other jobs, while others work a full-time job besides working part-time for us. They are the first school personnel some students see in the morning and the last one after school. This group of people are our bus drivers. Bus drivers must attend an eleven hour training, a yearly two hour training, a four hour refresher course every 5 years, obtain a CDL, air brake endorsement, and bus driver endorsement, pass a DOT physical, a dexterity test, random drug tests, yearly DMV check, and register with a drug and alcohol clearinghouse. Then they get the privilege of transporting our most precious gift, our children. They take them to school and back, on the shuttle between buildings, and to all sorts of activities. Bus drivers handle this tremendous responsibility of getting our students where they need to go safely while managing student behavior. They do it with compassion as they listen to students' stories over and over again. They build relationships with these students and encourage them. This is not to mention that they perform this job in all kinds of weather and country roads that may not be in the best condition after heavy rains or snowfall or possibly fog. Bus drivers are team players that are flexible to the wishes of coaches and sponsors. Be willing to stop so the kids can eat after the drivers themselves have had a long day at work that may have started at 6:00 a.m. with the pre trip bus inspection that they have to perform everyday. They do this knowing they will be up early in the morning getting ready for their route. While I have to say it is a somewhat thankless job, many of our students do tell the bus drivers thank you as the students exit the bus. These drivers are willing to serve our district and we are grateful for them. Bus Driver Appreciation Day is February 24th this year. If you see one of the following people please tell them thank you for the excellent job they do. The following drive buses for us on a daily basis: Ryan Jurgens, Roger Blank, Judy Schepler, Wayne Schepler, Brad Youngmark, Ryan Knaus, and William Henderson. Also, we have substitute bus drivers with: Robert Bennetts, Justin Patterson, Aaron Pistulka, Carla Wilson, Nurita Lambert, and myself. Thank you drivers for being willing to take on the responsibility of transporting our students and staff safely to their desired destinations. You are appreciated!

PBIS STAFF DEVELOPEMENT



January 4th served as an opportunity for teachers to prepare for the beginning of the second semester before students returned. Part of the preparation was to continue planning for a newly implemented program called PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports). Lona Nelson-Milks, SPED Director or ESU 11, also helped with PBIS staff development.

PBIS is an evidence-based process that works to increase student achievement, school attendance, and academic success while decreasing challenging behaviors.

Wilcox-Hildreth School formed the PBIS team over a year ago. The program is funded by a grant through the Nebraska Dept. of Education (NDE). The team consistently works with a PBIS coach provided by NDE to help establish best practices for implementing consistent expectations and common language and practices for students. The members of the team include Shannon Lovin, Kelly Simmons, Hana Mach, Jordan Glenn, Brandy Lunsford, Tiana Gibb, Katie Hohensee along with some parents and students whenever possible.

This semester you may see posters around the building that list the expectations of that location in the school building. The main goal of each location is to "SOAR".


