High School Graduation Requirements (cont.)

- Total of 120 credits earned
 - 5 credits- Full year courses
 - 2.5 credits- Half year courses
 - 6 or 7 credits Science courses with lab
- Every course that you take and every final grade that you receive is recorded on the student's transcript. At the end of each year, a grade point average is computed.
- Meet the requirements outlined in the district attendance policy:
 - 2.5 credit course = Maximum 6 absences
 - 5 credit course = Maximum 12 absences







Special Education



- In Class Resource- general education class co-taught by a general education and special education teacher. Students are expected to be able to master the NJ Core Curriculum with minimal accommodations and modifications to instruction/assignments provided as needed.
- Replacement Instruction small group instruction following the student's goals and objectives which correspond to the NJ Core Curriculum. Instruction is available in English, Math, Science, and History.
- Replacement Special Class Instruction designed specifically to assist students with greater academic, communication, behavior and/or social/emotional challenges. The goals and objectives, while related to the NJ Core Curriculum, emphasize application of the basic academic skills, transition issues, and the acquisition of social skills. Instruction is highly individualized based on the needs of the student.

• The mission of the Performing Arts Academy at Hopewell Valley Central High School is to provide a 4-year career-focused arts experience for emerging artists who possess exceptional talent and drive in the Performing Arts with the ultimate goal of preparing students for careers and/or admission to competitive colleges/universities in the performing arts. Our Academy is a place where serious students have access to a skilled faculty, like-minded peers, and a creative space to develop their artistry. By encouraging creative risk-taking through the development and performance of original works in a collaborative, interdisciplinary environment our Performing Arts Academy prepares students with the skills to be global citizens in an ever-changing world.

Sample Academy Sequence
