- ◆ While it is not yet time for apply for colleges, it is a great time to start really exploring career options. You may do this by: getting a part-time job in a field of interest, talking to professionals in those careers, and researching those careers online. - ◆ The ACT is going to be given to all juniors in February. If you can do anything to prepare for the test, that is a great idea. Silex R-I is paying for all juniors to test this year, so do your best.
- ◆ **Missouri Boys State** is accepting applications for the 79<sup>th</sup> session to be held June 16-23, 2018 on the campus of the UCM in Warrensburg. If you are junior, male and would like to be considered for this opportunity, please see Mrs. Wells. This is free to accepted students. Students applying should demonstrate high standards of leadership, character, scholarship and citizenship. Applications are due to Mrs. Wells no later than February 16<sup>th</sup>, due to the program by March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- ◆ **Missouri Girls State** is accepting applications for their 2018 session, which will run from June 24<sup>th</sup> through June 30<sup>th</sup>. The deadline for applications is March 1, 2018; however, applications must be submitted to Mrs. Wells no later than February 16, 2018. Please let me know if you are interested in participating. This is a paid opportunity for our delegate(s).
- ◆ **EXTENDED!!! HOBY** is a program specifically for students after completion of 10<sup>th</sup> grade. Silex H.S. can send three students to HOBY's Leadership Seminar at SEMO in Cape Girardeau from June 15, 2018 to June 17, 2018. Let Mrs. Wells know you'd like to be considered by Nov. 30, 17.
- ◆ **Missouri Leadership Seminar** is a 3-day program for exceptional sophomores from across Missouri. ## Classroom Visits, Parenting Classes, PLTC Auction...

- \* The 4<sup>th</sup>-Grade students. The 4<sup>th</sup>-Grade talked about **Celebrations Around the World**. We shared any particular nationalities that are part of our heritage, and we got a laugh with a video highlighting how different languages sound. And, they can tell you the translation of the name "John" in multiple languages!
- \* The 5<sup>th</sup>-Grade students explored the differences between **"Tattling" and "Reporting."** We also considered **Gossip** and how it is a lot like toothpaste. Ask your students how so. We read the book "Don't Tell the Whole World" by Joanna Cole. The goal is to learn when we need to share information and when we don't, what's productive and what is hurtful.
- \* 8<sup>th</sup>-Grade Students had the chance to take a good look at **PLTC** this past week, and I know many of them were excited about the programs that are available there. This will be something for them to consider as we do 4-Year Plans for high school later this year. Each student got to see three different programs. Some of those include: **Digital Media, 3-D Modeling, Health Sciences, Auto Collision, Law Enforcement**, and more.
- \* Students in middle school will benefit from **Crider Presentations** related to bullying, violence prevention, and other related topics in December. These will take place Monday, December 11<sup>th</sup> through Thursday, December 14<sup>th</sup>. More information will be sent home after Thanksgiving.
- \* Representatives from **Thrive** will present the **Best Choices Program** to our Students in Grades 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> during the month of January.
