Attendance Policy

Galesburg-Augusta takes attendance very seriously, we feel

it is a strong base for a student's success in and beyond high school. Being late to school or class affects student grades. Letters are sent home to families once a student reaches 6 absences in any given class and again for each class that a student may reach 10 absences. We work very closely with our Kalamazoo County Truancy Officer and report student attendance to them regularly. If your student is absent for any reason, the absence must be excused within 2 days of the absence. Absences and/or tardies reset at the semester.
