Monthly Revenue/Expense



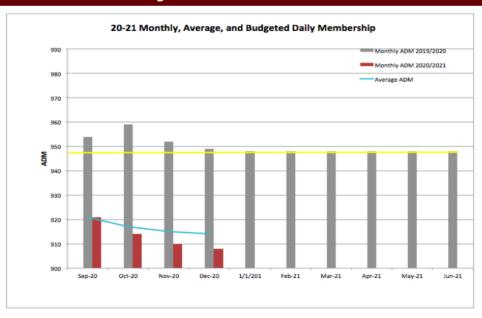

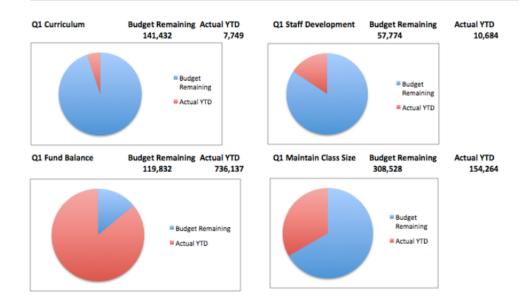

Enrollment by Month

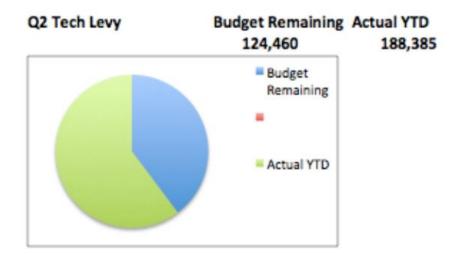
