# Dual Enrollment

### What is the purpose of Dual Enrollment?

The purpose of the Dual Enrollment Program is to provide Georgia high school students the opportunity to earn college credits as they simultaneously meet their high school graduation requirements by providing financial assistance toward their cost of attendance at eligible public or private colleges/universities and technical colleges in Georgia.



# What are the Eligibility Requirements?

1.Be classified as an 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> grade high school student pursuing a high school diploma from an eligible Georgia public, private, or home school

2.10<sup>th</sup> grade students may enroll with an SAT score of 1200 or an ACT score of 26

3.Be admitted to an eligible, participating postsecondary institution as a dual enrolled student. Receive approval from your high school guidance counselor

4.Be enrolled in courses listed in the approved on course directory

5. Maintain satisfactory academic progress, as defined by the

postsecondary institution

#### What are the Admissions requirements?

• Completion of all academic course work through the 10<sup>th</sup> grade and be classified as a eligible high school student

 3.0 GPA in required academic courses (must have completed 2 units of English and 2 units of Math)

 SAT, ACT, and Accuplacer scores are being waived for Juniors and Seniors at this time



# How do I apply?

- Submit official high school transcripts
- Submit any previous college transcripts
- Immunization forms submitted online through Med+Proctor

## How much is it going to cost me?



- The tuition is paid for by the state of Georgia Annual Operating Budget.
- Lab and course-specific fees are not covered.
- Online courses <u>may</u> require proctored exams. Proctoring fees are not covered.
- GSW will provide textbooks on a loaner basis each term. You will be charged for not returning the book(s).



# How much is it going to cost me?

- Participation and funding will be capped at 30 semester hours.
- If the student has received DE funding for 18 semester hours or less through the Spring term 2020, the 30 semester hour funding cap applies.
- If the student has received DE funding for 19 or more semester hours through Spring 2020, the student may receive an additional 12 semester hours.
- Students may choose to self-pay for additional courses.



# **Additional Information**

• A student will not receive funding for the same course twice.

 A student becomes ineligible to receive funding from the program after their 2<sup>nd</sup> withdrawal.
