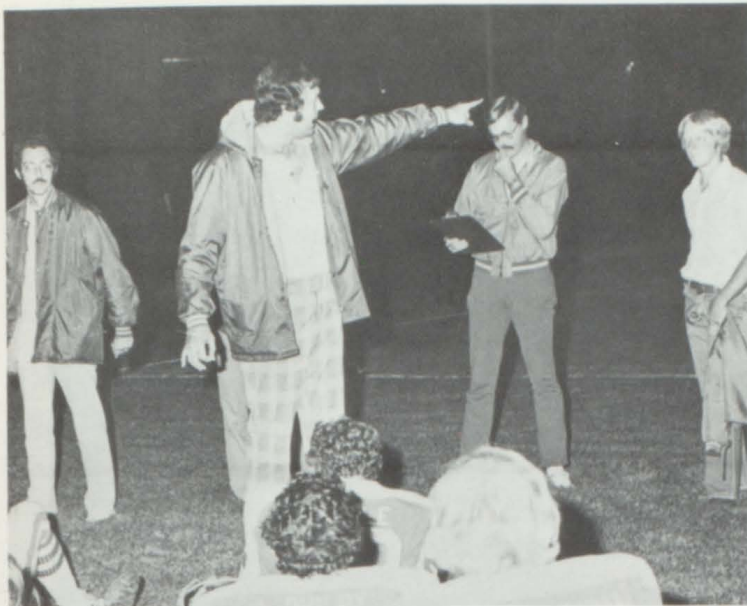
The game of football may mean an injured players now and than and sometimes the agony of defeat but to the players and fans it's all worth it.

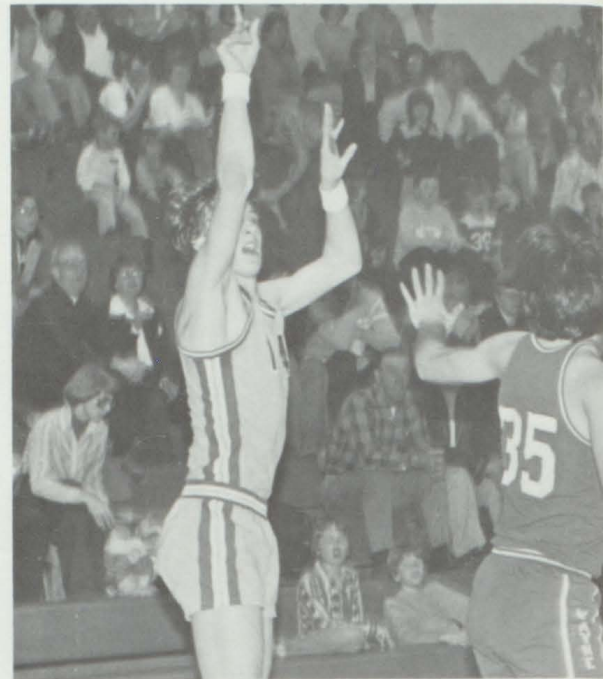
BOY'S BASKETBALL 1978- 79

The Pirates great efforts in playing basketball have made the Pirates number one in the hearts of all their fans.



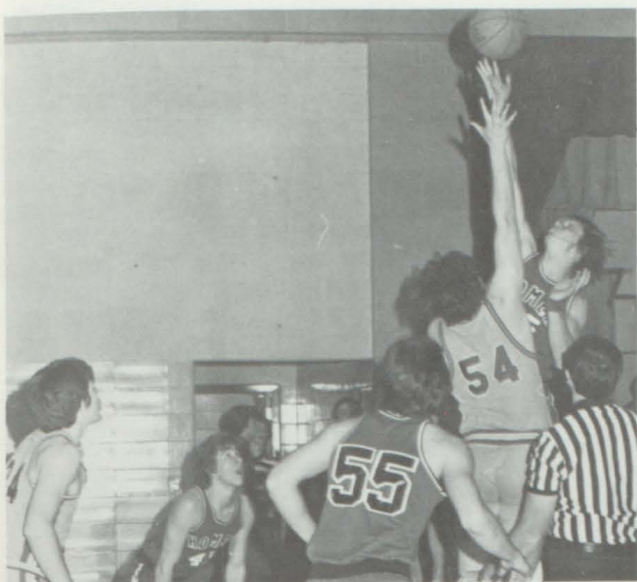

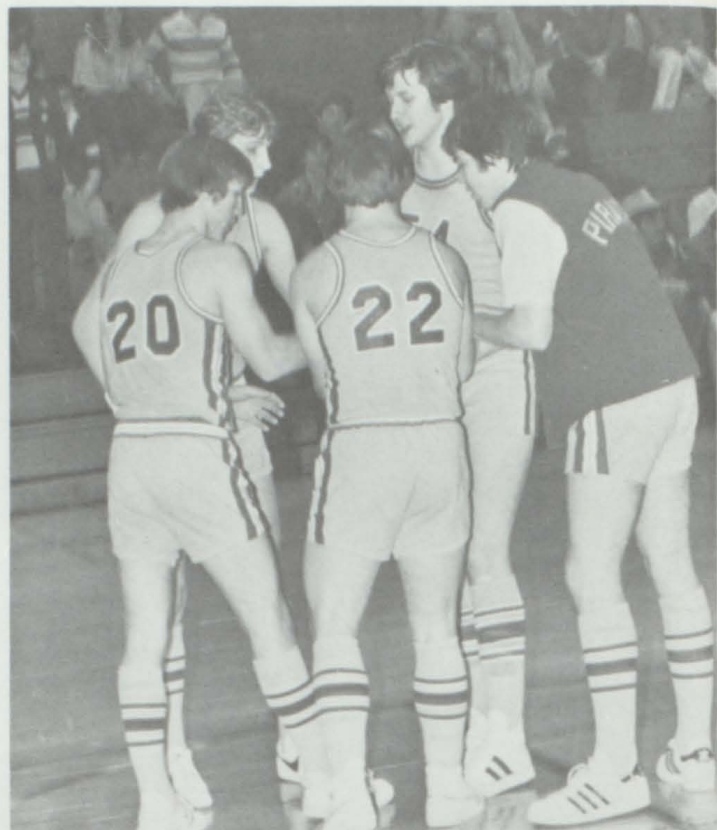

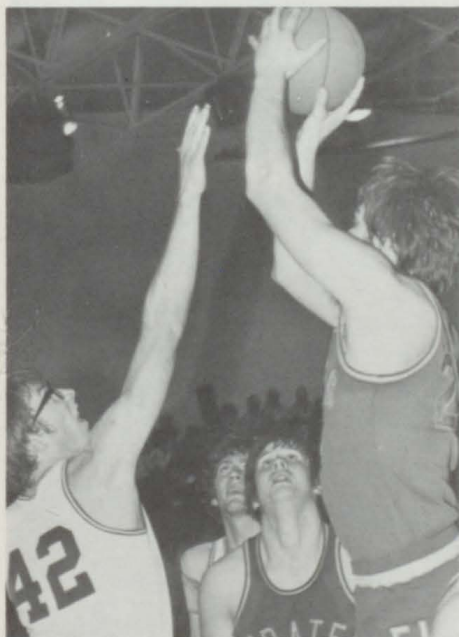

With four starters returning next year, the future looks very bright. There will be more talent and experience on the court than ever and that could mean alot maybe even a State win!

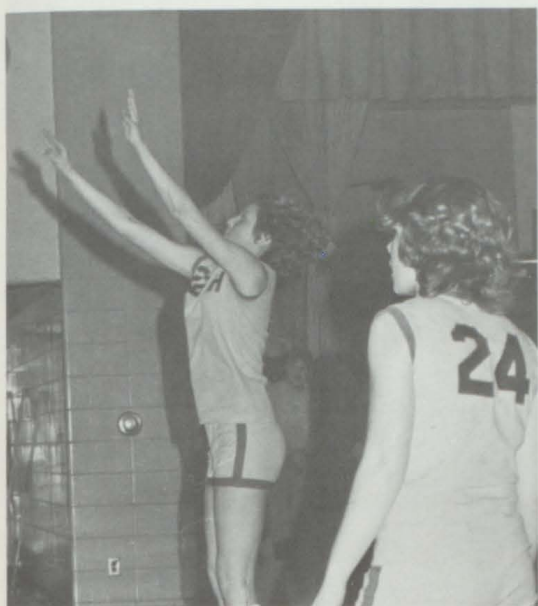
