







































FOOTBALL 1978





The game of football may mean an injured players now and than and sometimes the agony of defeat but to the players and fans it's all worth it.









VOLLEYBALL


While football pratice was going on outside, inside the future Piratettes volleyball team was working on the skills of the game, getting down the routine of ''bump, set, spike.''

With four starters returning next year, the future looks very bright. There will be more talent and experience on the court than ever and that could mean alot maybe even a State win!





This year six people made it to state.













For his dedication and many hours of patience, the band of E-H would like to thank Mr. Weber for giving us the chance to be the kind of students a band should be.


