
## **Gym Renovation Update**



Jaxon luckily was wearing his seatbelt at the time of the accident, if he was not wearing his seatbelt it could have possibly ended in severe injuries. Jaxon had safely only come out of the accident with only one broken foot. Ty Sandquists car got totaled. The truck driver did not care too much about the kids but had more worries about his truck, the cattle he was hauling and getting to his destination on time. The semi was full of cattle, Since they were close to town, the truck was not going at a high rate of speed so the cattle were not injured in the accident. According to an article on cdc.gov seatbelts are an effective way to save lives and reduce injuries in crashes. Accidents are a common leading cause of death for teens in the United states. Approximately six teens aged 16 to 19 die every day due to injuries from car crashes. In 2018, almost 2,500 teens who live in the US around the ages of 13-19 were killed in car crashes, and 285,000 were into the emergency room. 11.8 billion dollars were used to pay for damage in 2018. In the same year the motor vehicle death rate had been higher in teen males than female teen drivers. The presence of passengers increases the crash risk for the new teen drivers; this risk can increase with the amount of passengers in the car.Always keep in

mind that wearing your seat belt can save another person's life

or even your own.

Mrs. Maloney has now added this program to prepare students for the workforce after graduation. If college doesn't look like the right path for students, this new program will help certify you in whatever field is right for you! These certifications are only available for juniors and seniors currently. With the Covid-19 virus it is



harder to reach out to certain places but there are supplements for these jobs such as clinical careers. The school wants to give internship opportunities to help students gain experience for jobs after they graduate. You could get certified in any career without going to college. Mrs. Clayton, who is also working with the Industry Certification program, says, "We want to help kids gain skills that they wouldn't gain in a traditional classroom setting, it also gives them a leg-up when they enter the workforce." A completion of the certification requires students to manage their time, manage their resources, and leverage their skills. This helps them develop their character and skill which will benefit them once they leave school. "Students can also rely on these certifications to obtain gainful employment while they attend college to receive further technical training." states Mrs. Clayton. The students who take these certifications have gone through approval processes to be approved to do the certification. These certifications will make the students more competitive when they are seeking employment in the future than those who don't have them. Students can be confident that their certificate will help them be one-step-ahead.

This fire was on Byron Kramer and Randy Wise's land a few miles past the state line. It started at about 1:30 in the afternoon, and was spotted by Max and Gina Wear, who called Byron to inform whim about it. He went to check it out and found that there was indeed a fire and it was spread at a



rapid rate. The fire was started by two power lines rubbing together, sparking. Those sparks igniting the course, dry grass. The fire grew bigger and bigger, Sandhills Volunteer Fire Department, Wauneta Volunteer Fire Department, and Chase County Fire Department were paged and arrived to help put out the fire. Unfortunately, the fire moved into a pasture full of Byron Kramer's cows, so the cows were led out of the pasture and to a different one using a bale. Kim Kramer drove a pickup with a bale on it, the cows following her, while Byron and Duane, the hired hand, used four-wheelers to keep the cows following Kim. Luckily, none of the cows were caught in the fire, but most of the pasture land was burnt and is now unstable. If you go back there now, you will find that it is easier to drive the width of the burned area than it is to drive the length of it. Four pastures were burned in the fire, so driving through you will find three cut fences which allowed the trucks to get through and put the fire out.
