In-District Transfer Requests for the 2021 - 2022 School Year Priority Windows:

Grades 1-12: February 1-28, 2021

Kindergarten: February 1 - March 31, 2021

The Marysville School District's In-District Transfer Request window for the 2021 - 2022 school year opens February 1, 2021. If a transfer request is submitted after the priority dates listed above, but before June 1, the request will be reviewed no later than June 15, 2021.

While it is always recommended for child(ren) to attend their neighborhood school, we understand that circumstances may exist which creates the need to request a transfer to a school other than the neighborhood school.

Parents/guardians interested in enrolling their child(ren) in a school other than their neighborhood school or in one of the district's option programs (listed below), only need to complete an In-District Transfer Request one time during the grade span of that school. A new request is only required if circumstances change; such as moving to a different address or requesting a different school once a transfer is approved.

Marysville and Tulalip residents have first priority for in-district transfer requests.

Beginning February 1, 2021, transfer requests may be submitted online on the Marysville School District website. Once an application is made online, a confirmation email will be sent. If access to submit the form online is not available, visit the Marysville School District Service Center, 4220 80th ST NE, Marysville, WA 98270, Monday-Friday, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm for assistance.

If a residence is not within the Marysville School District attendance area boundaries, please do NOT submit an in-district transfer request. A [Choice Transfer](#) for out-of-district attendance should be used for this purpose.

If approved for an in-district transfer or choice transfer (out-of-district request), parents/guardians are responsible to transport their child(ren) to and from school. Below is a list of our district's schools and option programs:

OPEN ENROLLMENT

2021-2022

February is open enrollment time for the district. This includes the time when parents can complete a transfer request for their 5th Grade students, if they want them to attend for their 6th grade starting in September 2021.

ALL 10th Street Families that have a 5th Grader must still complete the transfer request!!

Current families with an incoming 6th grader will be automatically placed on the roster **IF** the family will also have a 7th or 8th grade student attending the same school year.

If the 6th grader is the only student attending the school, they will have to go through the lottery.

Transfers must be submitted by February 28th!

High School Selection!

Dear Families of Students in 8th Grade,

Next fall your 8th grader will be moving up to high school!

For the 2021 - 2022 school year, Marysville School District will continue with the process of giving students, parents and guardians the high school choice option.


This option allows students, in consultation with their parent or guardian, to select a high school by reviewing the High School Course Catalog and completing the Incoming Freshman School Selection Form to make a preferred first, second, and third choice for high school attendance. The High School Course Catalog will be available on February 1 and will be posted on the district website on the High School Resources page.

We cannot guarantee that students will receive their first or second choice, however, historically this process resulted in a very high percentage of students being placed in their first choice high school and nearly all students in their first or second choice when the request form was submitted by the deadline. Please note a very small percentage of students will be placed at a high school in order to provide for their specific educational needs.

Please submit the selection form by the deadline of March 31, 2021. If a form is not submitted, the district will place the student in a high school on a space-available basis.

10TH STREET FAMILY FAQ

Q: Do I have to fill out a Transfer request if I have a student already at 10th Street?

A: Yes, but only for the new, incoming student.

Q: Will my 5th grade student automatically be placed on the Roster if I already have a student at 10th?

A: It depends.

Only students that will have an older sibling attending the school in the same school year will have a spot reserved on the fall roster. That means the older sibling needs to be in 6th or 7th grade during the 20-21 school year.

For the 21-22 school year, your students would be in 6th grade with the older sibling in 7th or 8th grade.

If your older sibling is in 8th grade for the 20-21 school year, the younger sibling will be entered into the lottery for 6th Grade placement.

Q: Do I have to fill out a transfer form if my student already attends 10th Street?

A: No. Only **NEW** students must submit a transfer request.
