They include Academy, Adams 12, Aurora, Boulder, Cherry Creek, Colorado Springs, Denver, Douglas, Durango, Eagle, Falcon, Jeffco, Littleton, Mesa Valley, Poudre, Roaring Fork, St. Vrain, and Thompson. The remaining 101 districts generated 14.2% (\$137.4M) of the Mill Levy Override dollars. 59 districts have no Mill Levy Override.
