

MALONE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

In May of 2008, the Malone Family Foundation in Colorado established a \$2 million endowment at Wichita Collegiate School. The purpose of the endowment was to help make the educational opportunities and experiences at WCS accessible to academically talented students entering Grades 7-9 whose families demonstrate moderate to significant financial need. Inspired by the impact his own high school experience had on his future, Dr. John Malone founded the scholarship program with the hope that other young scholars would be given the same opportunity to reach their potential.

HOW WERE MALONE SCHOLARS SCHOOLS SELECTED?

WCS is one of only 50 schools in the country, and the only one in Kansas, that have been designated as Malone Scholars Schools. The Malone Family Foundation selected schools on the basis of:

- ♦ Academic caliber
- ♦ Quality of faculty and staff
- ♦ Excellent ability to enhance the education of gifted and talented students
- ♦ Strong Advanced Placement (AP) and enrichment programs
- ♦ Attention to the individual student's needs, interests, and talents
- ♦ Financial strength and stability
- ♦ A commitment to financial aid
- ♦ A school population that is economically, culturally, ethnically, and socially diverse

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR THE MALONE SCHOLARS PROGRAM?

Successful applicants for the Malone Scholars Program will:

- ◆ Demonstrate a record of academic achievement
- ◆ Score at or above the 95th percentile on a recognized standardized achievement or aptitude test
- ◆ Demonstrate financial need for at least 30% of tuition by applying for Indexed Tuition at WCS
- ◆ Be a United States citizen
- ◆ Meet the admission requirements of Wichita Collegiate School
- ◆ Show enthusiasm and motivation for maximizing his or her educational opportunities
- ◆ Be ready to enter Grades 7, 8, or 9

ACADEMIC APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants must complete or provide:

- ◆ Application for Admission form
- ◆ WCS Applicant Questionnaire
- ◆ Transcript and test scores from current school
- ◆ A recommendation from a current academic teacher

INDEX TUITION APPLICATION PROCESS

The application process involves completing a secure Parent Financial Statement online at the School and Student Services branch of the National Organization of Independent Schools. Visit our Affording WCS page of our website for more information.

WHAT IS INVOLVED WITH THE SELECTION PROCESS?

After application materials have been received, qualified finalists will be invited to come write a brief essay and interview with Collegiate's Malone Selection Committee. In a typical year, the committee will be able to select one or two Malone Scholars for the coming year.

WHAT EXPENSES ARE COVERED BY MALONE ENDOWMENT FUNDS?

The Malone Endowment will fund tuition expenses up to 100% of demonstrated need, as well as certain other school-related expenses such as lunch, supplies, and certain trips. Upper School Scholars also benefit with funding for a limited number of college applications, ACT and SAT fees, and a budget for trips taken during the college search process. Once selected for the Scholarship, the student continues as a Malone Scholar through graduation as long as he or she remains in good standing at WCS. Certain fees cannot be covered by Malone funding, such as athletic participation fees, fees for any activity that falls under the jurisdiction of the Kansas High School Activities Association, and optional trips.

WHAT IF I AM NOT SELECTED AS A MALONE SCHOLAR?

WCS offers the same challenging and enriching environment to all students, whether or not they qualify for or were selected as Malone Scholars. Each year, a number of the finalists are able to take advantage of the opportunities we offer with the aid of our Indexed Tuition program.
