3.1 Discussion – Scope and Direction of the Facility Advisory Committee

Explanatory Statement: To provide the Facility Advisory Committee with both scope and direction in examining options for future facility upgrades, repairs, remodeling or replacement, the board is being asked to discuss and consider what specific functions or tasks they would like to see addressed by the Facility Advisory Committee in support of the Board's goals related to the both the fiscal management of the district and the stewardship of district property.

- Philosophy Facility need-driven versus Finance/Cost driven project
 - Need driven cost follows design
 - Cost driven cost determines design and scope
- Strategy Packages vs. Pieces views of cost containment
 - Square footage reductions vs Feature reductions
 - o Sub-project elimination as a cost reducer and economy of scale
- General focus on facility develop and priority strategy; aspects to consider
 - Singular campus project or multiple campus project
 - o Small phase elementary project prior to addressing high school
 - Construct internal kindergarten wing, bringing those students to center of the building
 - Remodel/replace southern end of elementary (with or without kindergarten wing)
 - o Complete seismic upgrades to north elementary, with features upgrade on interior
- High school
 - o Address now, or after an elementary project
 - o Examine options for modular construction
 - o Examine options for sequential upgrade

3.3 Membership of FAC (Resolution 020321-3.3) Presented by Andrew Grzeskowiak Explanatory Statement: Since the last Board Action regarding the membership and composition of the Facility Advisory Committee (Resolution 091119-7.1) there has been a shift in members, with some no longer being able to serve. To provide a student perspective, it has been suggested that a membership seat be designated for a middle or high school student. Additionally, it has been suggested that the Siuslaw School Board formally request a representative from the City of Florence to serve as member of the committee to increase effective communication between the City and the District. In keeping with the prior wishes of the Board, the composition of the board shall be a majority community membership group, with district employees representing remainder of the committee. The board may consider giving direction for committee membership.
