Blended Learning: Week 4

Wood County Schools will continue with blended learning this coming week before returning to five-day-a-week classes Feb. 15.

- Students in Group A (last name A-K) attend school on campus Monday and Wednesday, and will learn remotely off campus on Tuesday and Thursday.
- Students in Group B (last name L-Z) attend school on campus Tuesday and Thursday, and will learn remotely off campus on Monday and Wednesdays.
- Friday, Feb. 12, is a Nontraditional Learning Day, also called an NT Day. All students will learn remotely off campus on Friday.

Students in K-8 also have the option of distance learning where students receive instruction online via Teams meetings and through Schoology. Limited space will be available due to class size limits and available courses.

Wood County Schools will return to 5-day-a-week in-person classes Feb. 15 for all students. As of now, high school students are still under an executive order by the governor to use the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Services COVID-19 map to determine how they will attend.

WVDHHR Daily COVID Map: The state will continue to update the DHHR's map each day at 10 a.m., with counties ranked Green through Red based upon community spread of the virus. If Wood County is marked **Red** on the WVDHHR daily map on a Sunday, high school students will receive remote instruction for the week. If Wood County is marked **Red** during the week, school will go remote the following day and the rest of the week until we are at a lower color on the Sunday map.

State COVID Vaccine Signup

West Virginians now have access to a COVID-19 vaccination pre-registration tool. West Virginia is the first state to deploy this new system through Everbridge, a global provider of critical event management technologies. The tool enables West Virginians to pre-register for COVID-19 vaccination and receive updates through text, phone and/or email. The West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources (DHHR) launched the new service Monday, January 25, 2021 on vaccinate.wv.gov.

Those who have already been placed on a waitlist through their local health department or other medical provider, as well as those who have already received their first vaccine dose, will be integrated into this new system and thus do not need to pre-register. The first week, the system will open for pre-registration. Moving forward, vaccination scheduling will also be available through the system. Scheduling will continue based on the state's overlapping phased approach for administering the limited vaccine supply.

Snow Days

When bad weather makes travel for dangerous or in some cases impossible, Wood County Schools will move to a remote instruction format. Teams meetings begin at 10 a.m. and students follow a two-hour delay schedule of classes.
