7th GRADE ENGLISH LITERATURE CIRCLE

As a follow-up to the recently finished historical fiction shared read-aloud <u>The King of Mulberry Street</u>, students have selected and started reading a choice novel for the brand new literature circle unit called "Seeking Home." These novels continue the study of themes focusing on discrimination based on ethnicity and religion and the effects of poverty and homelessness. While <u>The King of Mulberry Street</u> gave historical background around the immigrant experience in America during the late 1800s/early 1900s, these new choice novels focus on CURRENT-DAY issues around immigration, poverty, and homelessness. These novels examine social justice issues from the perspective of diverse characters, written by diverse authors.

Students will be reading and doing note sheets independently, which prepares them for future writing tasks. They will be working on novel analysis activities in small groups using online break out rooms through various online platforms. Students are also analyzing the plot together by completing a collaborative multimedia project through the online platform Sutori. The unit will be capped off with a student-selected independent creative choice project to showcase their knowledge of the novel. Hopefully, all of this will help them better understand the issues through the eyes of characters their own age.

Additionally, students will do some non-fiction reading in Newsela to understand the history and underlying social justice issues associated with their chosen novels, such as the circumstances that prompt a country's citizens to leave and the difficulties associated with being a modern-day immigrant or refugee.

A big thank you to the MEF for supporting the purchase of the online platform Sutori and to the Madison Board of Education for supporting summer curriculum writing, which helped create this new unit and the purchase of these novels.







7th GRADE ENGLISH WE GOT BOOKS CHALLENGE


How it works: Every day students pick one afternoon time period during periods 789 and spend those 30 minutes reading an independent book. At the end of the period, students complete the form to log their minutes.
