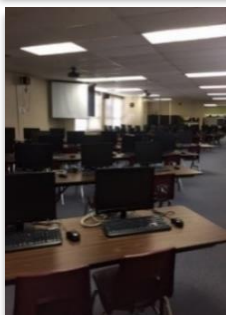

CAREER PATHWAYS

Oklahoma House Bill 2155 became effective November 1, 2017. A portion of the bill states:

Beginning with students entering the ninth grade in the 2019-2020 school year, each student shall be required to complete the process of an ICAP in order to graduate from a public high school with a standard diploma.

WHAT IS AN INDIVIDUAL CAREER ACADEMIC PLAN?

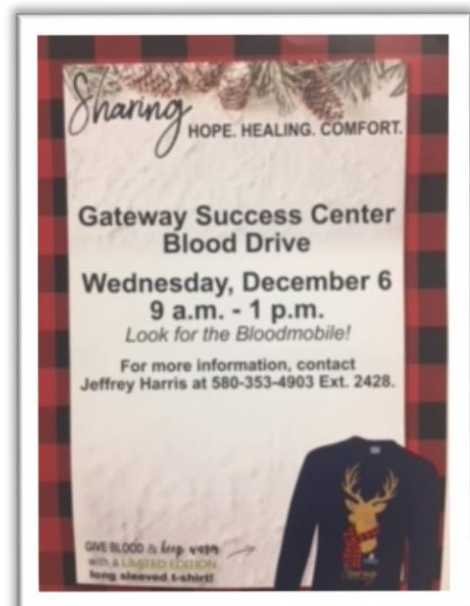
An ICAP is a multi-year process that guides students as they explore career, academic and postsecondary opportunities. Family, student and educators collaborate to develop the ICAP, which equips students with the awareness, knowledge and skills to create their own meaningful exploration of college and career opportunities. The ICAP is an evolving document that reflects students' changing passions, aptitudes, interests and growth.

The ICAP shall include, but not be limited to:

- career- and college-interest surveys
- written postsecondary and workforce goals and information of progress towards these goals
- intentional sequence of courses that reflect progress toward the postsecondary goal
- the student's academic progress, including courses taken, assessment scores, any remediation or credit recovery, any Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate; concurrent or dual enrollment credits, career certificate(s), certification(s), or endorsements and experience, in-service learning or work environment activities.

Our Career Counselors have added a third Career Advisor! Each are now part of the counseling staff in each high school. The students are beginning to take advantage of them being there full time. We would like to see the staff begin to utilize our resources as well.
