The agenda and minutes were emailed to SHAC committee members earlier. There was a first by Ashley Carlow and a second by Adam Ragland to accept the minutes as presented. All were in favor.

Nurse Neco Jennings & Susie Bailey informed the committee the overall sickness levels were not very high in the school setting. They both feel it is due to the extensive cleaning, handwashing, and face covering worn by students and staffs. The Christus St. Michael Nurses will be on campus on November 6th to administer flu shots.

Counselor Kayla Harrell updated the committee about the Drug Free week that included dress up days, door and pumpkin decorating, and a Drug Free Rally that included a talk from Officer Grandy and booths from various school organizations, including Office Vaughn and the impaired driving cars.

Neco Jennings presented the SHAC members with a letter from our school board indicating an intention to request a waiver from the Texas Department of Agriculture regarding the Summer 2021 Nutrition Program. There was a first by Adam Ragland and a second by Debbie Johnson to accept the school board's intention as stated. All were in favor.

Officer Latriesha Grandy updated the SHAC members about our recent emergency drill held in October and November. We will continue to conduct emergency drills as mandated by the state and as needed.

Superintendent Chris Bradshaw discussed with SHAC members the findings of the Texas State University review of Maud ISD's Emergency Operation Plan. One of the findings included updating our active shooter policy. Mr. Bradshaw answered questions from members regarding emergency and safety protocols within the school, as well as the different drills that are used for emergency preparedness.

Nurse Jennings updated the members on the number of students and staff we currently have that tested positive for covid-19 and are quarantined due to a "high risk" exposure. Mr. Bradshaw discussed statewide case numbers and our local response.
