After last month's grading shock (1.71 schoolwide GPA), I can now present the semester grades for HSMS.

Hopefully getting students back on campus will allow more connections to be made and elevate student wellness and mental health, thus creating a more well-rounded student, willing to put forth work.

DIBELS / easyCBM / ELPAC

HSMS is giving the midyear assessment beginning in late February and we hope to see improvement from the initial assessment. ELPAC (English Language Proficiency Assessments for California) will be administered beginning March 1st. The ELPAC consists of 4 components, Listening, Speaking, Writing, and Reading.

Classroom Observations

Administration has been conducting classroom observations and walkthroughs all year long. Several months have passed since I discussed the "teaching cockpits" our teachers are utilizing to teach their lessons. I want to highlight the outstanding instruction that continues to occur even though we've been virtual for several weeks. Our teachers are hitting on all cylinders. Just last week I viewed an entire lesson. Teachers are still greeting kids upon arrival. Teachers are still providing meaningful sponge activities. Teachers are still delivering lessons, providing guided practice, and assigning significant independent practice. Finally, teachers are assessing the lessons thoroughly. It's awesome to see such dedicated teachers embracing technology to do what they love most, teaching our students and doing it well.

Construction at HSMS, Room 73

Room 73 has been transformed into office space. Shawna Kane 's side came out fantastic. The other part of the building is currently getting changed into two smaller rooms, a waiting room and a counseling room. Todd and his crew are doing great work.









Mental Health and Bravery

Earlier I mentioned that Nicole is reaching out to students in an effort to build relationships and provide motivation to do well in school and in life. Linda Sandoval is regularly meeting with students regarding their mental health. Unfortunately many of Linda's clients don't feel comfortable speaking with her via Zoom. They prefer to meet in person where others will not be able to hear the discussion between counselor and client. Linda makes concerted efforts to meet all students requesting her services. Finally I'd like to acknowledge Jonathan Willy. Mr. Willy took a brave stance at our last staff meeting, stating "I don't feel comfortable failing students when I know I have not exhausted all forms of interventions." This occurred after a schoolwide discussion on grades and failing students. We are offering interventions, but I personally feel that we should be much more concerned with mental health instead of grades giving the current circumstances that COVID-19 has dealt upon us all.

Teacher Survey

At the February staff meeting I asked teachers, "What elements of DL should we plan to integrate next year's teaching model?" The teachers were placed into breakout rooms and collaborated to generate the responses below:

- Google classroom!(district wide/HSMS wide), Lightspeed!(essential tool), Distance Learning
- Academy(for students who can be successful in that format).
- I would like to continue to have "office hours" I am able to help kids one on one and that's nice.
- We also thought that maybe the county could set up a DL program so that it's not just on our district.
- We want to keep using Google Classroom, and also keep Kami please.
- We love using google classroom, and would love to keep the paid for version of google with the plagiarism checker. I personally like to have the ability to delete the assignments when the class is finished. We love lightspeed and plan to use it in-person when students are on technology. We do not feel like creating videos should be used in lieu of teaching. Students do not use videos effectively and often do not watch them. We would rather have the videos only as a resource not required viewing.
- Per music- Ryan does not need smart music next year. However, it would nice to see some of that money for in-person materials.
- Peardeck has been an invaluable resource. We would love to keep Peardeck going forward.
 Moving forward, IXL has been a valuable resource that would like to keep the paid version.
- DL Integration for 2021-2022:
- Individual Office Hours makes it more accessible to work with students one-on-one.
- Fridays maybe could be a Homeroom, Asynchronous and Synchronous Office Hours and meetings on this day! "Intervention Day"

- Continue with Google Classroom as main hub for assignments and work submission and also attach Loom videos.
- Continue a DL group still for students. Do away with contracts
- Keep Google Classroom Keep the DL option
- Having lessons available online for students who are absent for whatever reason. A new way
 for subs.
- Google classroom is a great hub for assignments and communication. Office hours were great to specifically support individual students and should be built into future schedules.
- Google classroom to streamline work, pear deck, DL for some students as needed, lightspeed-totally valuable! encouraging/requiring sick kids to stay home, increased cleaning, HR at the beginning of the day
