The "Zones of Regulation" program is being embraced as an excellent way to first empower children to identify how they are feeling, teach them that we can all control what we do with the behaviors connected to how we feel using "tools" and strategies appropriate for the setting, and then we can shift our feelings/behavior to the "expected" "zone". We are learning how none of the "zones" are bad, they are all human, but it is what we do with our feelings/ behavior that is our responsibility. This program is great for all ages. As of the release of this newsletter, our Pre-K through 5th graders will have all had at least one introduction to this program and the themes. Our guidance department continues to teach the themes of this program within their lessons with the entire school through 8th grade and in the new month, the 6th through 8th graders will have an official "Kick off" to learning the specifics. If you would like to utilize this very clear and easy program with your child or children and within your family as a whole, we are including a helpful video link for how to do this. 




CREATE A NEW DESIGN FOR WINDJAMMER DAYS!
