Dear CCS District Parents, Students and Community members:

It is my hope that this correspondence finds you well, managing our continued struggle with the ever-changing demands placed upon us by the pandemic, and looking forward to the vacation week. Hopefully, it will be a time of relaxation for all, whether we are staying right here in Otsego County or traveling. The purpose of this message is to provide you with information regarding the current travel advisory in effect for New York State and how traveling now has the potential to impact students' return to school. Please note:

Any person(s) planning to travel to a non-contiguous state, US territory or CDC level 2 or higher country, for more than 24 hours, must first obtain a COVID-19 diagnostic test within 3 days of departure, prior to arrival back in New York. Upon returning to New York, all individuals are required to serve a mandatory quarantine period of 3 days. On the 4th day of quarantine, each person must obtain another COVID-19 diagnostic test. If both diagnostic tests are negative, individuals may come out of quarantine. This applies to all adults and children.

For travel to a non-contiguous state for less than 24 hours, individuals need not obtain testing before returning and similarly, do not have to quarantine upon returning to New York. However, each person is required to complete a Traveler Health Form upon entry into New York and obtain a COVID-19 diagnostic test 4 days after your return.

Any traveler who refuses to obtain the required COVID-19 diagnostic test(s) as outlined above is required to quarantine after arriving in New York for the full 10-day period.

Travel to contiguous states—i.e., Vermont, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Connecticut, and Pennsylvania—is exempt from the travel restrictions. However, travelers coming into New York from one of these contiguous states must complete a Traveler Health Form upon their arrival in New York.

If you are traveling over the winter break, please be aware of the following protocols.

1. Upon your return, all children/students are expected to comply with [New York State Travel Advisory](#) requirements and must complete their travel-related quarantine before returning to school.
2. Parents/families are asked to share their travel plans **in advance** with their Building Principal. This will assist the school district in making arrangements to provide appropriate instruction and/or needed materials for your children while they are quarantined.
3. Please know that students who are in quarantine are not allowed to attend school or participate in any school activities, including extracurricular activities and athletics, until they have tested out of quarantine and can provide the proper documentation to the school.
4. Please reconsider or adjust any travel plans. Remember, your travel plans potentially have serious implications on the school district and our students, including extracurricular activities, as well as the greater Otsego County community.

5. Please know also that all employees are also expected to comply with the New York State Travel Advisory and any other quarantine or isolation order issued by a state or local government.

The following passage is read by the CCS Principal prior to each Ruggles Finalist competition and provides background to the competition.



William H. Ruggles died February 9, 1874. His obituary appeared in the February 12, 1874 issue of the Freeman's Journal. The following paragraph gives us a glance into the character of the man who is the reason we have this competition today.

Many of the young men among us – others scattered over the vast West- received at least a portion of their education at the hand of Mr. R., who was an efficient and painstaking Teacher. He loved the Common

School with ardent devotion, and for many years until the day of his death strove for its elevation and improvement. He would put aside business almost any time to attend a Teachers' Institute, a Convention of Common School Teachers, or the dedication of a new school house – and it was with a desire to do some good in a cause in which he had so much heart. Most of all, very naturally, he felt a great interest in the progress and success of the Union School of Cooperstown, and worked zealously and efficiently in its behalf. He was first a Trustee of this School District for many years, and then from its organization a member of the Board of Education.

The first recorded Ruggles contest was found in the Freeman's Journal dating back to July 3, 1879, which identifies The Ruggles Memorial Rhetorical Prize being established in 1877 with the winners receiving \$7 each.

Every junior writes a 600 to 800 word essay. Each written work is judged in two parts. Part I of the judging covers the originality of the content, written work, grammar, and vivid and musical choice of language. Part II of the judging covers the oral interpretation of each student's work.


Elementary Fitness Fridays & Friday Library Programs available during Hybrid Learning.


