

SNOW ICE CREAM

Ingredients:

4 cups snow
1 TBSP vanilla extract
2/3 cups sugar
1 cup milk

1. Chill a large bowl outside BEFORE you fill it with snow.
Otherwise the snow will instantly melt!
2. Mix milk, vanilla extract, and sugar. Add one cup of snow at a time until thick and creamy.

FLAVOR OPTIONS

Chocolate: Add 3 Tablespoons of Cocoa Powder

Strawberry: Add $\frac{1}{2}$ -1 cup of strawberry dessert topping.



Snow Pancakes

2 cups of flour
1-tablespoon baking powder
 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon of salt
1 tablespoon white sugar
2 eggs well beaten
1- $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of milk
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of fresh snow



1. In a large bowel mix and sift the flour, baking powder, salt, and sugar together.
2. Combine the eggs and milk in another bowl.
3. Slowly add the milk and egg mixture to the dry ingredients. Stir well and set aside. The batter will be thick.
4. Grease your griddle and get it good and hot. When the griddle is hot, quickly go outdoors and scoop up fresh snow.
5. Fold in 1- $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of new snow and mix well. Cook the pancakes as usual.

COLORED ICE ART

Bundt Pan – there are a ton of pans to try – try different shaped pans to get different designs!

5 different Food Colorings
Ribbon/String

1. Fill your bundt pan about half way up with water.
2. Place the bundt pan outside for about an hour so it only has a thin layer of ice on top. (This layer of ice will prevent the food coloring from mixing together).
3. While still outside, place 1-2 drops of each food coloring around the ice.
4. Continue to freeze until solid.
5. Remove from outdoors and run warm water under the pan (but not too long). It'll make the ice pop right out.
6. Tie the ribbon or string through the center of the hole.
7. Hang for a pretty decoration outside!



SNOW PAINT

Supplies Needed:

- Liquid food coloring
 - Cold water
 - Squeeze bottles/Squeeze Water Bottles
1. Carefully fill the bottle up with cold water, not too fast or it will bubble over. Leave an inch space from the top.
 2. Tightly place the lids back on and wipe down the bottles well, replace cap until ready to use.
 3. Carefully pop the top and use them to paint in the snow.

*Food coloring will stain, so be careful.



Snow Melting Experiment

Large Mason Jar or clear container

Dry erase marker

Fresh snow

1. Fill the jar with snow and mark its height on the side of the jar using a dry erase marker.
2. Leave the jar to melt. When the snow's all melted, measure the height of the melted snow on the side of the jar to compare the two heights.

Encourage them to look at the jar every 10-15 minutes and mark down the time and their observations until all the snow has melted.
