What is the Affordable Connectivity Program?

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a U.S. government program run by the [Federal Communications Commission \(FCC\) program](#) to help households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet.

You are likely eligible if your household's income is below 200% of the Federal Poverty Line, or if you or someone you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free and Reduced-Price Lunch. ***** All families who have a student attending the Bradford Central School District qualify for ACP due to the fact we provide free breakfast and lunch to all students through the Community Eligibility Program (CEP).**

Eligible households can receive:

- Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)
- A low cost service plan that may be fully covered through the ACP*

** Through a separate non-FCC initiative, additional no cost plans may be available to Affordable Connectivity Program enrollees.
