What is the Affordable Connectivity Program?

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a U.S. government program run by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program to help households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet.

You are likely eligible if your household's income is below 200% of the Federal Poverty Line, or if you or someone you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free and Reduced-Price Lunch. *** All families who have a student attending the Bradford Central School District qualify for ACP due to the fact we provide free breakfast and lunch to all students through the Community Eligibility Program (CEP).

Eligible households can receive:

- Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)
- A low cost service plan that may be fully covered through the ACP*

To receive the connected device discount, consumers need to enroll in the ACP with a participating provider that offers connected devices. *Contact your local internet provider and inquire about this amazing opportunity.*
