
# Our Classrooms - and Hallways - are Full of Learners











### LESSONS IN THE LIBRARY

rs. Race shares her love of books and reading with elementary students during their weekly visits to the library. Classrooms are scheduled for library time once or twice per week.

During each visit, Mrs. Race reads aloud to students or a guest reader presents a story via Story Online, followed by a discussion of the story. Before heading back to their classroom, students have time to explore the library and settle into a comfy beanbag chair to read or color a picture. Students always get to choose a book to borrow for the week.

### English/Language Arts Instruction in Fourth Grade









uring ELA instruction time, fourth-grade teacher Mr. Baker, along with Reading Specialist Mrs. Brewer, teach and reinforce key English/Language Arts skills as students rotate through small group instruction sessions. The lower student-teacher ratio of small group instruction has several benefits, including personalized attention to re-

inforce concepts and assess comprehension.

Mr. Baker's students are organized into three leveled groups for ELA instruction and those groups rotate through skill development and independent work stations.

In a recent session, students learned strategies to re-read using text evidence with Mr. Baker or worked with Mrs. Brewer on a context activity using the weekly vocabulary words, while the independent group worked on a writing assignment using the i-Ready program. i-Ready is an online reading program that helps teachers determine a student's needs, personalize his or her learning and monitor his or her progress throughout the school year.

### OCTOBER WAS ALL ABOUT PUMPKINS!













In October, Miss Doppel incorporated pumpkins into cross-curricular lessons in her first-grade classroom. Some examples included determining if pumpkin floats during STEM time; describing the characteristics of pumpkins during ELA; learning about the life cycle of pumpkins during science and counting pumpkin seeds during math. At the end of the month, students had fun carving their pumpkins.


# TALLEST TOWER COMPETITION
