

Understanding your negative COVID-19 result

School instructions: *The following information should be printed and provided to the parent or guardian of the student tested or the staff member tested.*

Today, you/your student tested **negative** for COVID-19. This means that it is less likely that you/your student are infected with COVID-19. However, falsely negative test results may occur. It is still possible that you are infected with COVID-19.

If you/your student have symptoms consistent with COVID-19, please call your healthcare provider for additional information. Follow-up testing with a more accurate COVID-19 test may be recommended. You/your student may not return to school until all symptoms are improving and you/your student is fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.

If you/your student have had close contact with a person infected with COVID-19 within the last 14 days, you may meet criteria as a “presumptive case” of COVID-19, even with today’s negative test result. Any person with symptoms compatible with COVID-19 who has had close contact with a case of COVID-19 within the last 14 days should contact the local public health department at _____ for additional instructions.

Your negative result will be reported to your local public health authority, but your test result will otherwise be kept confidential.
