What is the role of a Board of Education Member and how does it differ from that of the Superintendent?

The Board of Education

The Board works with the Superintendent to create a District vision, set goals, and establish framework of desired outcomes.

The Board reviews, modifies, and approves all **District policies**.

The Board adopts a budget puts it to voters for approval and sets school tax rates within legal limits.

The Board hires, supervises, and manages the superintendent. It is their only employee.

The Board has a **clear chain of communication** (Board President and Superintendent) that helps to avoid confusion and misinformation.

The Superintendent

The superintendent implements the school board's vision by making **day-to-day decisions** about educational programs, spending, staff, and facilities.

The Superintendent ensures polices are implemented and practiced district-wide.

The superintendent hires, supervises, and manages the central staff and principals.

The Board should ask questions directly to the Superintendent who will **gather information and provide a response.** Superintendents want well-informed Board members!
