


WHAT ARE WE LEARNING?

ELA

Ms. Mclaurin - ELA Update:

Eighth Grade will continue reading the class novel To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee. Students have completed part one of the novel and have an upcoming assessment based on this portion of the novel. Students will continue completing two I-Ready lessons for ELA each week. Reading logs are also due weekly for independent reading that is completed outside of school using a separate book of their choice.

This month we will focus on completing our second novel, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, and write our essay on it. Students should read AR articles and their self-selected novels to earn their 20 AR points. The Paper Airplane Book Report is due on January 10th.

In math this month, students will begin working with systems of equations. We will be solving systems by graphing, using substitution, and using elimination. Students understand how to graph a single line in slope-intercept form, now it's time to see what happens when we have multiple lines represented on the same graph. What does it mean where they intersect? What does it tell us if they do not intersect?
