

RICE COUNTY LEARNING CENTER

The Rice County Learning Center is an on-site high school completion program for adults and a credit recovery program for high school students who need to retake a course.

The enrollment process for the Center is to initially complete the forms including a transcript request from their previous school. Adult students are then required to attend two 6.5-hour days in our building working on courses. The first 6.5-hour day is to be completed sometime between the first day of school and September

20th. The second 6.5-hour day is to be completed sometime from September 21st through October 4th.

After that, the student has completed the enrollment process and can complete most of their online courses at home if they choose to.

Our building consists of two classrooms. One is for traditional-age students that are pre-approved to attend by the local high school principal. The other is for adults who have not earned their high school diploma and would like to also improve their conversational English. The program is set up to work at your own pace. Our Center already has its first graduate this school year, Megan Gwynn, who graduated on September 22, 2022.
