



Notification of Potential AB2306 Eligibility

The purpose of this document is to notify the above student and educational rights holder (parent/guardian) that this student *may* be eligible for modified graduation requirements through AB2306, after reviewing credits completed, previous involvement with the Juvenile Justice System, and school transfer after 10th grade. Under the mandates of AB 2306 eligible students have special rights to remain on track for high school graduation. This includes, the opportunity to stay for a 5th year to complete Bay Area Technology (BayTech) graduation requirements or graduate with <u>California state minimum graduation requirements</u> if a student is *not reasonably able* to finish the BayTech graduation requirements by the end of their 4th year of high school (12th grade).

Please note, students graduating with state minimum graduation requirements will likely not meet minimum eligibility to go directly to a UC or CSU after graduating from high school. A counselor can review the student's specific eligibility. Students graduating with state minimum graduation requirements will be eligible to attend a California Community College, you can learn more about community colleges at www.californiacolleges.edu.

GRADUATION OPTIONS (Check One)		
Option 1: Reject the exemption and graduate using the BayTech graduation requirements in 4 or 5		
years.		
Attempt to graduate high school at the end of 12th grade (or a 5th year) by completing all BayTech graduation requirements. The right to a 5th year applies even if the student will be older than 18 that additional school year.		
Option 2: Accept the exemption and graduate under the state minimum graduation requirements in 4		
years.		
Graduate by completing California state minimum graduation requirements. The student will be eligible for a regular high school diploma but sacrifices additional educational time for college and career readiness and likely become ineligible for UC or CSU enrollment directly after high school.		

Once the student and educational rights holder has made a decision on graduation option, they should check the appropriate box. If student and educational rights holder choose to pursue eligibility for the exemption, the High School Linked Learning Office will do a final review for eligibility and update student's graduation track.
