

# SPECIAL PROGRAMMING Adult Education Houlton Higher Education Center

The RSU29 Adult Education program offers programming to meet the needs of the adult population of Southern Aroostook County, preparing them for lifelong learning, responsible citizenship, and productive employment.

Courses are offered in 5 major categories:

- HiSET (formerly GED) & High School Completion courses help people complete their high school education.
- **2. Literacy courses** give people the guidance, support, and training necessary to improve their literacy skills and the literacy skills of their family.
- 3. College Transitions courses assist people of all ages wishing to make the transition into college-level courses. College courses are available at the Houlton Higher Education Center.
- **4. Business & Skills Training courses** help prepare Maine citizens by providing the training and education to find employment and improve your current job status in health care and other in-demand careers.
- 5. Personal Enrichment courses include courses in skills such as personal computing, cake decorating, woodworking, and quilting.

Region Two School of Applied Technology was established in 1973 to provide Career and Technical Education in the area served by (5) high schools: East Grand, Hodgdon, Houlton, Katahdin, and Southern Aroostook Community School.

Our goal is to provide each student with a technical skill that can be the beginning of a successful career. Region Two values education and promotes furthering their training by attending post-secondary education, military, apprenticeships, and immediate career occupations, necessary for work in today's workforce.

We offer dual college/articulation credits through most all of our programs. Enrollment and programming have grown in the past three years. Staff at Region Two are trained professionals who are dedicated to meeting students' educational goals for career preparedness.



# Did You Know?

Our Food Services Department runs one of the largest restaurants in Aroostook County serving over 176,000 lunches and 50,000 breakfasts yearly. RSU 29 also provides a summer feeding program to area communities serving over 17,000 meals.

### Student Performance Standardized Test Results

Standardized tests are used in RSU29 as a way of comparing the actual achievement of our students to their anticipated achievement. Standardized tests also are used as a means of comparing our students' achievement with other students through the State of Maine. The Maine Educational Assessment (MEA) is the assessment utilized for grades 3-8 and 11. Standardized tests are only one of many, formal and informal, measures used to gain further understanding of our students' learning.






