A letter from the Choctaw Nation follows this letter and explains the PHAT Program for our 7th and 8th Grade students. This program is totally optional and is in no way intended to Parent your child on abstinence, rather, it is intended to be a supplement for you as a parent in dealing with this sensitive topic.

Your child will be bringing home a permission form for participation in this Program. Again, it is totally optional and if you do not wish for your child to participate, they will be allowed to stay in the normal classroom and continue working on assignments. Please be sure to return the consent form attached to the handout your child will bring home.

During the 2020-2021 school year the Choctaw Nation GAME Program will be implementing an evidence-based educational curriculum Promoting Health Among Teens, Abstinence Only in <u>School</u> Districts located in Coal, Haskell, Hughes, Latimer, LaFlore, and Pittsburg counties. The counties of Coal, Hughes, and Pittsburg have some of the highest teen pregnancy rates in Southeast Oklahoma. The Promoting Health Among Teens, Abstinence Only curriculum will be taught to Middle School students in grades 7th and 8th. This program is funded by the Family and Youth Services Bureau. The program goal is to promote avoidance of sexually risky behaviors and non-marital sexual activity in a way that teen sexual activity is not normalized. This program helps students learn about puberty, sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), including HIV, and pregnancy prevention. Each participant will receive age appropriate, evidence-based and medically accurate lessons on refraining from non-marital sexual activity and preventing other youth risk behaviors. The Promoting Health Among Teens (PHAT): Abstinence Only lessons are designed to teach youth personal responsibility, self-regulation, goal setting, healthy decision-making, a focus on the future, and the prevention of youth risk behaviors such as drug and alcohol use without normalizing teen sexual activity. The Promoting Health Among Teens (PHAT): Abstinence Only lessons emphasize that abstinence until marriage is the safest choice. All lessons will be taught by trained instructors from the Choctaw Nation GAME Program during the school day. Seventh and eighth grade students will receive 12 lessons. Students will learn and practice ways to resist the pressure to have sex. Promoting Health Among Teens (PHAT): Abstinence Only program includes homework activities to help parents and children talk about personal limits. This homework is voluntary and students will not share their parent's answers in class. You are welcome to preview the Promoting Health Among Teens (PHAT): Abstinence Only materials. What Are the Risks of The Study?

Taking part in the study is voluntary. If you agree to participate and then decide against it, you may withdraw for any reason and leave the study at any time. Not participating in the program will not affect your grades or school involvement in any way.
