Dear Parents/Guardians:

Eatontown Public Schools continues to plan in order to increase students' time in school as long as conditions continue to improve and health guidance does not change. Our collective success has been created due to the various members of our school community cooperating and collaborating together.

The Third Marking Period closes on Thursday, April 15th. As per our district Restart Plan, I am asking parents to consider sending their child back to school in-person following a four-day per week, or possibly five-day per week, one-session day schedule. Please note that depending on enrollment numbers, some classes may not have the recommended six feet of social distancing between students. **Parents and guardians will have until Monday, March 15th to make this decision.**

Remote learning students may return to in-person learning beginning Monday, April 19th. In order to change your child's schedule from remote learning to in-person learning, parents and guardians must contact their child's principal before Monday, March 15th with their request. After Monday, March 15th, the next check-in point for students to transition from remote learning to in-person learning will be in September 2021.

If you desire to change your child's schedule from remote learning to in-person learning, or from in-person learning to remote learning, please contact the principal of your child's school before Monday, March 15th via email using the contact information below:

It is important to note that if you do not wish to change your child's schedule at this time, no further action is required. Hybrid AA/BB students will automatically be put into the four-day or five-day per week schedule and remote learning students will automatically remain fully virtual unless the principal is contacted otherwise. As information and/or guidance changes, the district will communicate any necessary information in the future. The ultimate goal is to have students return to school for five full days in September 2021.
