$$\frac{1}{4} < \frac{3}{4}$$

The alligator eats the **greater** numerator!

* If both your **NUMERATORS** are the same ...

$$\frac{3}{4} > \frac{3}{8}$$

The alligator eats the **smaller** denominator!



