Over the summer the high school sent seven teachers to Kennewick to participate in the Character Strong training. Character Strong is a program designed to help schools infuse character and social emotional learning with academics. Research says when a school takes time to promote a culture of character and develop socialemotional skills, grades increase and negative behaviors decrease. The high school has adopted the Character Strong curriculum and is implementing the program through advisory. This year students were placed in mixed gradelevel advisories as a way of building relationships and mentoring. Through the Character Strong program and advisory, we hope to create a culture that values community, leadership, and compassion.

This year we hope to help students build their character by teaching them the 8 Essentials: kindness, honesty, patience, respect, humility, selflessness, forgiveness, and commitment. We hope to help students strengthen their character with intentional workouts that will help them develop the 8 Essentials. In the words of the Character Strong team, "Personality is what you wear to the gym; character is how hard you work out."
