November was the month every gamer was anticipating for the largest gaming releases of the year, with the next game of the Call Of Duty franchise, Black Ops 3, being released on the 6th of November as one of the biggest online multiplayer for consoles. Even if you're not a big multiplayer gamer you can play the futuristic campaign alone or with 3 other friends learning how to use your cybernetic augmentations or survive hordes of the undead on the newest zombie map that takes place in the 40's and introduces 4 new characters to the Call of Duty Zombie story line. In the map shadows of evil you will have to navigate around finding and activating rituals to unlock pack-a-punch. We reviewed the game and give it an 8.6 out of 10. For Fallout fans who has been waiting five years since the release of the last fallout game, there has been some significant changes to core gameplay elements that takes some time getting use to for veteran players. In this post nuclear apocalyptic game, you are a survivor of Vault 111, a cryogenic social experiment that malfunctioned and you wonder the commonwealth of former Massachusetts, more specifically the Boston area in search of your kidnapped son. We reviewed the game and give it 9.3 out of 10.

Another big release for the gaming community is the backward compatibility that allows Xbox 360 game to be played on the Xbox one. The first release allowed 100 games to be playable and the next will add 100 more to be playable.

Winter Driving Tips By Sammy and Travis

Things to keep in your car:

- Jumper cables
- Two or more blankets
- Snow shovel and scraper
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Extra clothing: cap, mittens, parka and overshoes or boots in case you have to walk for help.
- High calorie, non-perishable food like candy and canned nuts.
- Sand or strips of carpet for traction.
- Extra windshield washer fluid and antifreeze
- Flares or reflectors
- Cloth/paper towels
- Piece of bright cloth
- Matches, lighters, or some way to start a fire

Things to remember while driving:

- Leave plenty of room for stopping.
- Pay attention don't try to out drive the conditions. Remember the posted speed limits are for dry pavement.
- Use brakes carefully. Brake early. Brake correctly. It takes more time and distance to stop in adverse conditions.
- Bridge decks freeze first. Due to the difference in the exposure to air, the surface condition can be worse on a bridge than on the approach road.
- Exit ramps are an even greater challenge during the winter since they may have received less anti-icing material than the main line. Be aware of this when exiting the highway.
- Turn on your lights- to see and be seen. Brush the snow off your headlights and taillights frequently.
- Remember to SLOW DOWN! Also, seat belts should be worn at all times - it's the law.
