- c. Mr. Gray informed the Board they did not need to take action this month on the 2014-15 budget he sent them. He wanted them to have ample time to review it and to address any concerns they may have.
- d. Mr. Gray reported on the activity stipend comparison he sent the Board. After he and Mr. Falloon review them, they felt the only stipend when needed to be changed was the Academic Bowl Team Coach. Their recommendation was to raise it to 4% of base and adding an assistant coach if the numbers reached 20 or more students. This stipend would be 2% of base. It was the consensus of the Board to make this change which was figured into next year's budget.
- e. Mr. Sellenriek moved to add \$750.00 to the base of the certified salary schedule and give the same percent increase to administrators and classified staff seconded by Mr. Woods. The motion passed. VOTE was 7-0
- f. Mrs. Stille made the motion to set 2014-15 meal prices as follows:

High/Middle School Lunch - \$1.70 High/Middle School Breakfast - \$1.10 Elementary Lunch - \$1.60 Elementary Breakfast - \$\$1.10 Adult Lunch - \$2.10 Adult Breakfast - \$1.35

Mr. Finke seconded the motion. The motion passed. VOTE was 7-0

- g. Mr. Gray reported that Immaculate Conception School in Montgomery City are now affiliate members of MSHSAA for the 2014-15 school year. Mrs. Stille made the motion for 7th and 8th grader students from Immaculate Conception School to participate in extracurricular activities that does not have a grade as long as they meet the same policy the District has regarding attendance, grades, and discipline. Mr. Muchow seconded the motion. The motion passed. **VOTE was 7-0**
- h. Mr. Ross Kidwell updated the Board on the construction project at all four building sites. Jonesburg is coming along nicely. The walls are poured and they are waiting on steel. They ran into a water line issue at the HS/MS and will have it tested to see if it is "standing water" or a break in the water line. They are waiting on the storm sewers to come in at Montgomery City Elementary. Shortly, they will make plans on asbestos removal this summer.
- i. Mr. Woods made the motion to declare the old game clocks and scoreboard surplus property seconded by Mr. Muchow. The motion passed. **VOTE was 7-0**

a. Mrs. Stumbaugh asked the Board if they had any questions on the Differentiated Instruction Report. There were no questions.

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- b. Mr. Gray reported the following:
 - A reception for Dr. Della Bell, new principal at Montgomery City Elementary, we held this evening prior to the Board meeting.
