SAT test- is a curriculum- and standards-based educational and career planning tool that assesses students' academic readiness for college.	11 <sup>th</sup> grade	April 13 <sup>th</sup>	State	4 hours
PSAT- test is a college preparatory exam aligned to state academic standards and the 11 <sup>th</sup> grade curriculum-based college entrance exam.	9 <sup>th</sup> , 10 <sup>th</sup> grades	April 13 <sup>th</sup>	State	4 hours

<b>WIDA– for ELL students to test their language barrier and to determine if services are needed.</b>	<b>Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grades</b>	<b>September</b>	<b>State</b>	<b>30 minutes to 1 ½ hours- depending on the age of the student</b>
<b>NWEA- a standardized test that measures a student’s growth in the areas of reading, language arts, math and science 3 times a year and tracks a student’s growth in these areas so that teachers can adjust instruction and provide interventions.</b>	<b>Kindergarten through 11<sup>th</sup> grade</b>	<b>August , December and May</b>	<b>Local</b>	<b>12 hours for all tests in grades 3-10 for the entire year</b>
<b>Dibels- reading comprehension and fluency test taken 3 times a year to track students.</b>	<b>Kindergarten through 6<sup>th</sup> grade</b>	<b>September, December, and April/May</b>	<b>Local</b>	<b>10 minutes per student</b>
