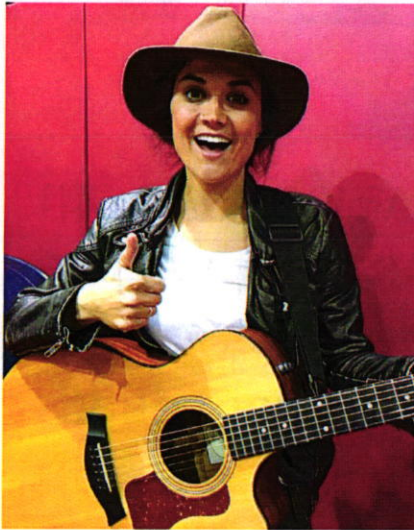
Red Ribbon Week
