

# Van Buren FFA Receives Living to Serve Grant from National FFA Organization.

The Van Buren FFA chapter in Van Buren, Ohio has been awarded a Spring Semester-Long Living to Serve Grant in the amount of \$500. The nationwide program provides grant money to local FFA chapters to support semester-long service-learning projects that address needs related to community safety; environmental responsibility; hunger, health and nutrition; and community engagement during the fall semester.

Van Buren FFA plans to help address the small town community by creating a sustainable garden that produces a wide variety of fruits and vegetables. It is open to the community and upkeep is provided by students and community members. The goal of this project was to teach students how to care and maintain a garden and provide for our community.

The program provided over \$52,000 to FFA chapters in 25 states. The 2022 Spring Semester-Long Living to Serve Grants are sponsored by Tractor Supply Com-


# Student-Musicians Represent VBMS in District Honors Ensemble

#### **Familiar Face Joins VB In Person**

On March 17, Ms. Serena's 7<sup>th</sup> grade social studies classes welcomed Mrs. Chen, a former virtual Chinese teacher at Van Buren. Ms. Serena's students had just finished a unit on ancient China when Mrs. Chen visited. Forging connections between the classroom and real-world experiences, Mrs. Chen taught the students about her upbringing in Taiwan. She elaborated on the tension occurring between China and Taiwan, then she had the students explain how the circumstances in the two far-east countries resembled the developing war between Russia and Ukraine.

The students were engaged in a Play-Doh activity in which they created mooncakes out of real cooking molds. As they created their fake mooncakes, they were treated to a snack that closely resembled the real thing. We learned that mooncakes could only be found abroad during the mooncake festival, which traditionally falls during September of each year. The students were also ready for a bit of friendly competition when Mrs. Chen demonstrated how to use a spin-top, which is similar to the Beyblade game.

Mrs. Chen also spent time with Mr. Obenour's 9<sup>th</sup> grade World History classes. During her time with the high school students, Mrs. Chen shared her background of growing up in Chinese and Taiwanese culture. Students engaged in open discussions regarding the current events in China and Taiwan. We are very fortunate to have the opportunity to reconnect with Mrs. Chen and appreciate the insight that she provided to our students with her real-world experiences. Mrs. Chen brought valuable experiences and lifelong memories with her when she came to visit, and we'd love to see her back next year!


