



Community Garden

Van Buren's FFA Community Coordinators just reopened the FFA Community Garden to the public this Spring. The Community Garden is open to the public, which means anyone is allowed to water the plants, pick weeds, and gather produce FOR FREE. The Community Garden has a variety of produce to choose from including fruits, vegetables, and herbs. This is located at Hoadley Park which is just North of where Ash and Cherry Street meet in the town of Van Buren. There are seven main boxes, along with a watermelon patch, strawberry box, and two herb boxes. There's also water containers to water the garden. In box #1 which is closest to the water containers, it contains jalapeno peppers, sweet banana peppers, and golden bell peppers. In

box #2, there are onions, celery, eggplants, chocolate beauty bell pepper, and serrano peppers. In box #3, there are tomatoes, cauliflower, broccoli, and red acre cabbage. In box #4, it only contains 100 super sweet tomatoes and hillbilly tomatoes. In box #5 there are beets, carrots, white sweet spanish onions, chives, and lavender. In box #6 and #7 They consist of peas, lemon boy yellow tomatoes, green beans, and asparagus (the asparagus will be ready next summer). The community Gardens herb boxes consist of plain parsley, thyme, and sage. There is also a bonus box that consists of blueberries (but won't have produce till next summer), and flowers. This is OPEN to the public. Feel free to come pick produce, water, and weed!

Career Planning/Advising Update

Beyond VB Internship Opportunity: The Beyond VB Internship Program is available to all juniors and seniors who have passed all classes in the preceding semester (second semester of 2021-2022 school year) and are on track for graduation (juniors must have earned at least 12 credits and seniors must have earned at least 16 credits; must currently be enrolled in at least five credits; and must

have passed 100% of state testing requirements as of the end of the 2021-2022 school year).

A student who meets those criteria is eligible to be released for up to two periods a day to participate in a career internship which aligns with the student's career goals. Participating students will be expected to complete at least 60 hours (earning .5 transcripted credits pass/fail) and up to 120 hours (earning 1 transcripted credit pass/fail) in the internship. Participants will also be expected to work toward and earn the OhioMeansJobs-Readiness Seal, a state-defined diploma seal.

If any juniors or seniors who meet these criteria have not completed the Beyond VB Internship Interest form for the 2022-2023 school year, they can complete the form at *bit.ly/BeyondVB* (URL is case sensitive).


Middle School News
