The elementary school has been working to incorporate additional learning experiences that extend beyond the walls of the classroom. T.L. In February, the kindergarten and 1st grade students visited Marathon Performing Arts Center to see the production of **The** Pout-Pout Fish. In March, the third grade participated in Maple Sugarin' Days at Litzenberg Park.

High school students have completed many career exploration opportunities this year. A variety of speakers from GROB Systems, Inc., Raise the Bar Hancock County Apprenticeship, and DNC Hydraulics have presented to our students. Four seniors are participating in the Beyond VB Internships. In November, juniors and seniors had the opportunity to participate in a LinkedIn Workshop. Freshmen chose from a variety of career interviews posted on the CareerCast YouTube channel to watch and respond to. In March, students had an opportunity to participate in the Millstream Career Center Reverse Job Fair. Seniors participated in a Senior Career Day in which they chose from three activities: complete a career assessment and update resumes, attend a college visit, or complete a shadowing experience with someone in a career they would like to further explore. Sophomores participated in **Sophomore Shadow Day** in which they spent a day shadowing a professional in a career they are interested in.



We continue working towards creating a districtwide instructional framework that will support all educators in creating learning environments based on instructional best practices. The newly formed Instructional Team met for the first time to discuss districtwide instructional patterns that were discovered through instructional rounds. The goal of this group is to provide feedback on the creation of the instructional framework and habits of instructional leaders.
