Required Training Topics

- Title IX's definition of "sexual harassment"
- The scope of the school's education program or activity
- How to conduct an investigation and grievance process
- How to serve impartially, including by avoiding prejudgment of the facts at issue
- How to avoid conflicts of interest and bias
- Decision-makers must receive training on any technology to be used at a live hearing, and on issues of relevance of questions and evidence, including when questions and evidence about a complainant's sexual predisposition or prior sexual behavior are not relevant
- Investigators must receive training on issues of relevance to create an investigative report that fairly summarizes relevant evidence



Prohibitions on Training

Must not rely on sex stereotypes

 Must promote impartial investigations and adjudications of formal complaints of sexual harassment



Title IX Training - Posting Requirements

- Under the Title IX Rule, students, employees, the Department of Education, and the public will be able to examine a school's training materials, providing a necessary safeguard to improve the impartiality, reliability, and legitimacy of Title IX proceedings. This requirement will improve the overall transparency and integrity of a school's Title IX policies and procedures.
- Schools must publish training materials that are up to date and reflect the latest training provided to Title IX personnel.
- Does not permit a school to *choose* whether to post the training materials or offer a public inspection option; if a school has a website, the school must post the training materials on its website.
- Must be maintained by the school for at least 7 years.
