

Measure J

Build a new elementary school to relieve student overcrowding, upgrade school fire alarms and emergency preparations, improve handicap accessibility (ADA), upgrade technology and student internet access, and replace aging roofs, plumbing and wiring at La Gloria Elementary School and Fairview Middle School.

Measure K

Expand vocational education classrooms including engineering, technology and agricultural science, upgrade school fire alarms/emergency preparations, improve handicap accessibility (ADA), upgrade science labs, technology and student internet access, replace outdated portables, and repair classrooms including roofs /plumbing.





COVID-19 Gonzales (Zip Code 93926, 426 cases)





CAASPP TESTING

Standardized Testing continues...

The state Board of Education approved a shorter version of the CAASPP test which will be administered in late Spring, 2021. While the majority of Superintendents (myself included) and Districts questioned the logic of administering a standardized test during a pandemic, the CDE is required to ensure a standardized assessment occurs in order to comply with Federal guidelines which come with federal funding. The test window will also adjust starting in February, rather than January.
