SUMMER 2023: Digital Literacy in the Classroom

Course Objectives

- 1. Participant will develop a technology tool to increase student knowledge in a content area.
- 2. Participant will develop lessons and learning activities that align technology to the NGLS.
- 3. Participant will develop formative and summative assessments that infuse technology and align with the NGLS.

SUMMER 2023: Differentiated Instruction & NGLS

Course Objectives

- 1. Participants will develop vocabulary-related lessons and activities.
- 2. Participants will design grade-level specific kinesthetic classroom activities.
- 3. Participants will design activities encouraging friendly competition.

SUMMER 2023: Book Study- The Teacher Toolbox for a Calm and Connected Classroom

Course Objectives

- 1. Participants will define the "invisible backpack" and how it affects students and teachers.
- 2. Participants will identify strategies to deal with adverse childhood experiences, trauma, and chronic stress.
- 3. Participants will identify ways to prevent and process meltdowns and burnout.

SUMMER 2023: Safety First- Physical Education

- 1. Participants will receive updated Lifeguarding Certification.
- 2. Participants will receive updated Concussion Management Certification.
- 3. Participants will update unit plans to incorporate the new state standards.

SUMMER 2023: Engaging Student with Poverty in Mind

Course Objectives

- 1. Participants will demonstrate an understanding of the impact of poverty on student learning by answering discussion questions and responding to colleagues.
- 2. Participants will demonstrate knowledge of how to build engaging lessons for students by creating a project to implement in the classroom.
- 3. Participants will demonstrate an understanding the importance of educators knowing how poverty impacts the brain by sharing information learned in the course with their team or other building staff.

SUMMER 2023: Building the Foundation of a Thoughtful Classroom

Course Objectives

- 1. Participants will score effective or higher on the teacher evaluation rating scale as measured by formal observations, information observation forms, self-reflections and student academic performance.
- 2. Participants will be able to design thoughtful lessons which include the five episodes of effective instructional design elements, include a variety of research-based strategies and tools, and engage students in higher order thinking as evidenced by principal observations, teacher lesson plans, scored samples of student work, and interviews with students.
- 3. Participants can improve the quality of classroom instruction through the increased use of research-based strategies and tools with the use of Thoughtful Teacher.

SUMMER 2023: Microsoft 365 Applications to Support NGLS

- 1. Participants will be able to create an Excel Spreadsheet, a PowerPoint Presentation, Sway, explore TEAMS to create assessments/assignments, and/or Publisher document to be used in their classroom (or shared with a colleague).
- Participants will update currently used document(s), create new documents, and become
 increasingly knowledgeable and comfortable with the new functions of the updated version of
 Microsoft 365.
- 3. Participants will create a Microsoft Form and/or Quick Form to be used with their department, grade level, other staff and/or students.

Fall 2023: Student Engagement, Classbuilding and Teambuilding

Course Objectives

- 1. Participants will create and implement one teambuilding activity designed to improve students' communication and social skills and evaluate for increased student engagement.
- 2. Participants will create and implement one academic based classbuilding activity designed to increase student retention of content/skills and evaluate for increased student engagement.
- Participants will create and implement one non-academic based classbuilding activity
 designed to improve the classroom community and evaluate for increased student
 engagement.

FALL 2023: RTI and MTSS: Practical Tools and Strategies

Course Objectives

- 1. Participants will be able to identify how they can improve academic and social-emotional performance with scaffolding and demonstration of learning techniques.
- 2. Participants will be able to identify how they can establish and teach class rules, expectations, and consequences.
- 3. Participants will be able to create a list of research-based strategies for math, literacy, reading, and writing development.

FALL 2023: The Book Whisperer

- 1. Participants will identify the three types of readers and develop a plan to develop each category of reader into students that enjoy reading.
- 2. Participants will identify and develop nontraditional reading comprehension activities.
- 3. Participants will identify and develop a book list for classroom libraries, read alouds, or shared reading.
