Miss West 2021 Madison Russell Parents & Community Members: The operation of school

The operation of school has been complex during the COVID-19 pandemic as we have attempted to balance the educational, social/mental health needs of students, student and teacher safety, and the ability to implement a hybrid model of teaching and learning. Our teachers and staff have worked tirelessly throughout the year and your support has been tremendous and very much appreciated.

The administrative team along with the Board of Education reviews data concerning COVID-19 as it relates to schools on a regular basis. Please recognize that it is difficult making decisions that affect the lives of individuals and families as well as the community as a whole. Beyond the benefits of in-person instruction, we must also consider the physical health of each student and staff member. As COVID-19 cases decrease and vaccines become available. we will be returning to school on a 100% in-person basis.

On March 15, 2021, we will begin to operate on Level 2-Orange of the reopening plan.

- Grades PK-4 will attend 100% four days per week (Monday-Thursday). Fridays will be remote learning.
- Grades 5-12 will continue to attend on a
 50% rotation. Students
 will report 2 days a
 week for face to face
 instruction. The remaining 3 days will be
 remote learning.
- The Senator Virtual Learning Academy will continue to be available for 100% remote learning.

On March 29, 2021, the district will operate on Level 1—Yellow of the reopening plan.

- All students attend school five days per week within recommended guidelines found on the return plan.
- The Senator Virtual Academy will continue to be available for 100% remote learning.

We are cautiously optimistic about our return to inperson instruction, this is not the time to let our quard down. We urge our community members to abide by the CDC and Ohio Department of Health guidelines to fight COVID-19 by avoiding large social gatherings, wearing face coverings, and practicing social distancing. We will continue all protocols while students are at schools, including temperature checks as we ask that symptomatic students remain at home.

As always, we truly appreciate your understanding, patience and support during these most difficult times.

Mrs. Leah Blevins Awarded \$2000 in Step-It-Up Wellness Challenge

The OHSAA, in partnership with the Health Action Council, recently hosted a two-week Step-It-Up Wellness Challenge for Ohio schools. PWHS teacher Mrs. Leah Blevins was nominated by Superintendent Bazler to represent Washington-Nile School District in the challenge after he noticed she takes daily walks around campus during lunch. Mrs. Blevins was honored as one of six "regional stepper" winners and awarded \$2000 for health and wellness efforts in the district. She explained her motivation as follows:

When quarantine began in March, I began cooking big meals and along with that came some extra weight. I decided to start walking to try to shed the weight. When school began back this fall I didn't have much time to walk so I began walking during my lunch break. This led to my school superintendent seeing me walking around our campus and he entered me in the Fitbit challenge. Prior to the competition, my goal was to walk 10,000 steps a day. I felt that since I was competing I should try to double that. I began to walk the circle around my floor each time the bell rang, walk back and forth in front of the board while teaching and continued to walk during my lunch period.

After the first day of the competition I saw that I was going to have to work way harder if I was going to stand a chance of winning. I was told several times to give up because people could be attaching it to the ceiling fan or anything to get that many steps. However, I am a firm believer in "Whatever your hand (or feet) find to do, do it with all your might." I even explained to my 10 and 6 year old that I may not win but life isn't always about winning—it's about giving it your best effort. Once my family realized that I was committed, they got behind me 100%. They would walk with me in the evenings, my Granny talked with me on the phone while I walked, teachers I worked with would walk with me during their free

time and I even started getting up before work and running. I kept telling myself that low and steady wins the race and that if nothing else, I had set a good example for my children. I tell them ALL the time that we may not be the best but we always have to give it our best and that was what I did.

In the end—surprisingly enough to even me—I came out a winner! I am so thankful for the help and support of my family, friends and colleagues and am so grateful for this opportunity.

PWHS plans to use Mrs. Blevins' \$2000 award to purchase a water fountain with a water bottle filler to install by the gymnasium.

Ashlynn Pfau: SOC Division II - Women's 200 Meter Individual Medley






Miss West Sydney Carter Takes 2nd Place at 2020 Riverdays
