

VISITORS AND VOLUNTEERS

Thank you for sharing your time and energy with the students and staff of Marysville School District. We look forward to seeing you at Totem!

Please visit our District website or stop by our school office to complete a Volunteer Application Form. Volunteer status is good for two years and you must undergo a Washington State Patrol Criminal History Review. Please contact our office to verify your status if you've been previously approved.



BUS PASS PROCEDURES

If your student is going home on a bus with a friend or getting off at a stop that is not their normal route, a parent or guardian must send a note with your student that day, phone calls will not be accepted. The student will need to bring their note to the front office to receive an official transportation pass. Bus drivers will not allow students to ride unusual routes without a school pass.

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

MSD requires a new request for the administration of medication to be completed <u>each year</u>. This applies to both prescriptions and over-the-counter medications. Please request a parent and doctor permission form or independent medical form.

We need your student's prescription medication to be brought in with the original container with pharmacy label. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact our Health Room Assistant in person or at (360)965-0510.

CONTACTING STAFF

We encourage you to log-in through Family Access in SKYWARD if you would like to contact a teacher or staff member via email.

STUDENT INFORMATION NEEDED

Did your family move, get a new phone number, or was there a change in custodial arrangements over the summer? Maybe your TMS student's sibling got a driver's license and you want them to pick up their brother or sister for appointments, etc. All these changes and any others need to be updated with your school's main office. Please stop by for a new emergency card or send a written note to school with changes. These notes must be signed by a parent or guardian.

We will not release any student without verifying that the person picking the student up is on his/hers file as a guardian or emergency contact. For your student's safety, we ask for picture identification whenever you request to pick them up during the school day. Student safety is our main concern!
