Curriculum Philosophy

Hanover Park Regional High School provides a comprehensive educational program offering a wide variety of learning opportunities for all students. The curriculum is the means to attain the established educational goals of the district. More specifically, the curriculum is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills required:

- (a) For success in college/university level studies or in the workplace
- (b) To meet the challenges of the global economy
- (c) To become life-long learners
- (d) For practicing responsible citizenship and family life
- (e) For the successful completion of the NJ State Assessment Program.

Full-year and half-year courses are offered in eleven content areas. Some courses are required to meet district and NJ State Department of Education mandates while others provide students with electives to fulfill individual interests and needs. Courses are aligned with the NJ Student Learning Standards and incorporate technological components.

It is expected that college-bound students experience college-level work by 12th grade through our AP course offerings and dual enrollment coursework.

Career Pathways are opportunities for students to design an educational program aligned with possible post-secondary college or career interests. Elective course clusters are sequenced for students to follow a career path. Students can select their rigorous required courses and electives to create a "mini-major" or concentration of courses that will be helpful as they pursue post-secondary opportunities. Please note that students may opt to choose a variety of elective courses to explore potential opportunities.


Please note that the career pathways are suggested courses based on career interest. Students are not locked into one pathway and may select any course as long as they have met all requirements and prerequisites.



Additional Options

Senior options are designed to give seniors the opportunity to explore valuable topics, careers and experiences outside of the Hanover Park Regional High School District Program of Study in real-world settings. Each option has its own requirements and students should speak to their guidance counselor about which option is best for their goals.

<u>Dual Enrollment</u> - Students in various courses have the opportunity to participate in dual enrollment programs sponsored by Seton Hall University, Fairleigh Dickinson University, NJIT and Rutgers University.

<u>AP Capstone Program</u> - provides students with an opportunity to engage in challenging scholarly practice of the core academic skills necessary for successful college completion. The ability to think independently, write effectively, research, collaborate, and learn across disciplines is essential for success in college, career and beyond.

<u>Senior Service Project</u> - This student-initiated program offers seniors an opportunity to conclude their high school educational experience and requirements by providing community service to the district. Students must know that this program is a privilege, not a right.
